



### Honourable Minister

Election Rule 108(6) of the Representation of the People Act, Chapter 2:01 (the Act) requires the Elections and Boundaries Commission (the Commission) to cause to be printed, after each election, a report giving:

- (a) the number of votes polled for each candidate by polling divisions;
- (b) the number of rejected ballots;
- (c) the number of names on the revised list of electors and on the list of special electors; and
- (d) any other information that it may deem fit to include,

Further, the said rule specifies that a copy of the report shall be forwarded to the Minister responsible for local government, as well as to the Chief Executive Officer of the Municipal Council.

Acting in accordance with the said election rule 108(6), therefore, the Commission submits herewith its report on the Bye-Election in the Point Fortin Borough Corporation held on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> January, 2021. The data in respect of (a) and (b) above are provided in **Appendix I**. A summary of the information contained in Appendix I is given in **Appendix II**, while the requirement at (c) is met in **Appendix III**. Other pertinent information deemed fit for inclusion in the report, in addition to what is contained in this text, can be found in **Appendices IV-IX** inclusive.

### 1. Announcement of the Date of the Election

By means of correspondence dated Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> December 2020 from Her Excellency, the President of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago, the Commission was informed that the Honourable Prime Minister had agreed to Monday 25<sup>th</sup> January, 2021 as the date for the conduct of a Bye-Election in the Electoral District of Hollywood in the Point Fortin Borough Corporation, consequent on the declaration by the said Corporation of a vacancy in the Electoral District. The vacancy arose as a consequence of the election of the then Councillor

for the electoral district as Member of Parliament for the constituency of Point Fortin in the 2020 Parliamentary Election.

The correspondence also indicated that Nomination Day had been fixed for Monday 4<sup>th</sup> January, 2021.

### 2. ELECTORAL REGISTRATION AND REVISED LIST OF ELECTORS

In accordance with the provisions of Section 30 of the Act, a nine-day period of electoral registration was conducted from 17<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> December, 2020.

While the time-span cited actually amounts to eleven (11) calendar days, the legal stipulation of nine (9) days was not exceeded. This is due to the fact that Christmas Day and Boxing Day (i.e. Friday 25<sup>th</sup> December, 2020 and Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> December, 2020), which fell within the period, had to be excluded in accordance with provisions of section 159(1) of the Act.

During the period of the Electoral Registration one (1) notification of change of address was received. There were no new registrations.

The Preliminary List of Electors posted, as required, on the date of the commencement of the period of the Electoral Registration, reflected an electorate of two thousand, seven hundred and forty-seven (2,747). Changes made to this list on the completion of the exercise, by way of additions, resulted in an electorate of two thousand, seven hundred and forty-eight (2,748) on the Revised List of Electors which was posted on 4<sup>th</sup> January, 2021. There were no adjustments to the Revised List. Consequently, there was no need to post a Supplemental List.

### 3. APPOINTMENT OF RETURNING OFFICER

Ms. Patricia Bradshaw was selected as the Returning Officer for the Electoral District by the Commission, and the Writ of Election was duly prepared and delivered to Her Excellency, the President on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> December, 2020 for signature.

Commissioner, Ms. Roslyn Khan Cummings, on behalf of the Commission, officially appointed Ms. Bradshaw as Returning Officer, and presented her with the Writ of Election issued by Her Excellency the President on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> December, 2020. The office of the Returning Officer was established at 1<sup>st</sup> Floor, Patrick Gordon Building, No. 83 Main Road, Point Fortin.

### 4. Nomination Day/Proceedings

On Nomination Day, 4<sup>th</sup> January, 2021, two (2) candidates were nominated by two (2) political parties. There was one (1) independent candidate. Pertinent information relating to the candidates nominated is provided in **Appendix VIII**.

The breakdown of the candidates nominated is provided in Table 1 below, together with approved symbols.

### 5. POLLING STATIONS AND STAFFING

Six (6) polling stations were established for the purpose of the taking of the poll in the five (5) polling divisions which constituted the Electoral District.

A total of forty-six (46) individuals received training in polling station and related poll-day activities. Of this number, forty-three (43), comprising thirty-six (36) females and seven (7) males, were assigned to work on poll-day. They were recruited to fill the positions of Presiding Officer, Deputy Presiding Officer, Poll Clerk, Officer-in-Charge of the Ballot Box, Information Officer, Roving Officer and Sanitization Clerk.

### 6. COMMUNICATION

The Commission issued messages in various media, which satisfied legal requirements for publication, and undertook proactive communication which publicly shared accurate, timely information to increase voters' understanding of new processes and procedures, as well as messages which focused on protecting voter participation and inclusion.

In addition to the usual pre-election advertisements, the Commission produced television and radio advertisements aimed at addressing any concerns which the voting public may have had about the electoral process during the COVID-19 pandemic. These advertisements provided information on the measures implemented by the Commission, aimed at preventing the spread of COVID-19 and to safeguard the health and well-being of voters on poll-day.

### 7. PREPARATION FOR THE POLL/IMPACT OF THE COVID-19 VIRUS ON ELECTION PROCESSES

As it did in the preparation for, and conduct of the 2020 Parliamentary Elections, the first election to be held during the pandemic, the Commission again strictly followed the protocols set out by the Ministry of Health. Consequently, changes were made, but not restricted to:

- the training programme for prospective poll-day staff;
- the layout of polling stations; and
- the means by which election-related documents were made available to the public and election officials.

In all of this, the use of technology proved to be an effective tool.

Further, strict adherence was observed with respect to physical distancing, the mandatory wearing of masks, the wearing of gloves where deemed necessary, the sanitization of the hands of both voters and polling station personnel and the frequent sanitization of equipment provided for use at polling stations.

### 8. CONDUCT OF THE POLL

Voting by Special Electors commenced as scheduled, on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> January, 2021 at the office of the Returning Officer, while similar activity began on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> January, 2021 at the Special Polling Stations established by the Commission for that purpose. All persons who turned up to vote were able to exercise their franchise without incident.

On poll-day, Monday 25<sup>th</sup> January, 2021, voting commenced as scheduled; and there were no incidents which negatively impacted the voting process. Election Day went as anticipated, and all persons wishing to exercise their franchise were able to do so in the stipulated time.

As is customary, members of the Commission were deployed in the Electoral District on Election Day in order to monitor operations at polling stations. The casting of ballots and the counting of votes were incident free. Generally, the Commission was satisfied that poll-day arrangements enabled the electorate to exercise their franchise freely and fairly.

### 9. CHALLENGES TO PRELIMINARY RESULTS

Following the declaration of the preliminary results of the poll by the Returning Officer, the independent candidate, Mr. Christopher Kadeen Wright, filed a request for a recount of the votes cast in the six (6) polling stations, including those where he had won the count.

The process commenced at 3:00 p.m. on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> January, 2021 and was concluded at 5:50 p.m. on the same day. The recount did not alter the results of the preliminary count. Mr. Leslie Anthony J. Chang Fong, the candidate for the People's National Movement, was declared the winner.

### 10. ELECTION DOCUMENTS

All relevant election documents have been submitted to the Commission for storage and are being maintained in safe custody in accordance with the Act.

### 11. RESULTS OF THE POLL

The 2021 Local Government Bye-Election in the Electoral District of Hollywood was won by the People's National Movement; their candidate having received three hundred and ninety-four (394) votes or 51.91% of the valid votes polled. The independent candidate received three hundred and seven (307) votes or 40.45% of the valid votes polled and the candidate for the United National Congress received fifty-eight (58) votes or 7.64% of the valid votes polled, as shown in Appendix IV.

The number of electors exercising their right to vote amounted to seven hundred and sixty-one (761), representing 27.69% of the total number of eligible voters. The number of valid votes polled was seven hundred and fifty-nine (759) or 99.74% and the number of ballots rejected was two (2) or 0.26%.
