



Sir,

The By-Election to fill the seat in the Parliamentary Electoral District of Chaguanas West, which was declared vacant on Friday 10th May, 2013 by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, took place on Monday 29th July, 2013 on the basis of a Writ of Election dated 21st June, 2013 issued by His Excellency, the President of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago.

The statement following is submitted in compliance with the provisions of Election Rule 108 (6) of the Representation of the People Act, Chap. 2:01 (the Act) which requires the Elections and Boundaries Commission (the Commission) to "... cause to be printed" "...after each election" a report giving:

- "(a) the number of votes polled for each candidate, by polling divisions;
- (b) the number of rejected ballots;
- (c) the number of names on the revised list of electors and on the list of special electors, and,
- (d) any other information that it may deem fit to include."

The data requested in respect of (a) and (b) above are given in **Appendix I**, and in respect of (c) in **Table I of Appendix IV**. Other supplementary information relevant to (d) above is provided hereunder.

1. Electoral Registration and Revised List

In accordance with section 30 of the Act, an Electoral Registration was conducted from Tuesday 28th May to Friday 7th June 2013; a period that included two (2) public holidays: Corpus Christi, celebrated on Thursday 30th May and, Indian Arrival Day, commemorated on Friday 31st May, 2013. These two holidays were discounted in accordance with section 159 (1) of the Act. The four (4) Registration Area Offices involved in the electoral registration were those for the

Registration Areas of Chaguanas, Arima/Piarco, San Juan and Tunapuna. The number of Polling Divisions in the Electoral District embraced by these offices totalled thirty (30).

Within the Electoral Registration period there were thirty-eight (38) transactions comprising four (4) first-time registrations, eighteen (18) internal-transfer transactions and sixteen (16) external-transfer transactions. As part of its preparation for this activity, the Commission's Department posted appropriate publicity announcements in the print and electronic media so as to encourage eligible electors to embrace the opportunity to regularize their registration status. Electoral Registration proceeded without hitch or incident.

For the nationwide Parliamentary Election held on Monday 24th May 2010, the number of electors on the Revised List of Electors for the electoral district of Chaguanas West was twenty-five thousand, seven hundred and fifteen (25,715). By comparison, the electorate on the Revised List for the By-Election of 29th July 2013 for the same Electoral District totalled twenty-seven thousand and forty-five (27,045), equivalent to an increase of approximately 5.2 per cent.

2. Polling Stations and Staffing

Fifty-one (51) polling stations were established throughout the Electoral District to serve electors in the existing thirty (30) Polling Divisions. These polling stations were established at fourteen (14) venues throughout the electoral district. Refer to **Appendix III**.

Three hundred and six (306) prospective poll-day staff underwent training. However, only two hundred and seventy-six (276) out of the lot were recruited to work on polling-day. The latter included fifty-one (51) Presiding Officers, fifty-one (51) Deputy Presiding Officers, three (3) Roving Officers, eighteen (18) Information Officers as well as Poll Clerks and Officers-in-Charge of Ballot Boxes. The poll-day staff were trained by ten (10) main trainers and ten (10) assistant trainers.

3. Contesting Parties and Conduct of the Poll

The former Member of Parliament for the Chaguanas West Constituency whose seat in Parliament was declared vacant on Friday 10th May, 2013 had, subsequent to his resignation, applied to the Commission in his capacity as Interim Leader of a new political party, the Independent Liberal Party (ILP), for assignation of a party symbol for the ILP. This was done on Thursday 27th June, 2013, one day after publication of the Form No. 35: Notice of Election. Having therefore complied with the provisions of Election Rule 23 (2), the Commission approved the symbol.

At the close of Nomination-Day proceedings conducted on Monday 8th July, 2013, six (6) candidates, including the Interim Leader of the ILP, had been nominated to contest the election. However, only five (5) candidates actually contested the election, the candidate of the Party for Integrity and Morality in Politics having withdrawn his candidature on 24th July, 2013. The names of the contesting candidates, their party, the abbreviations of the party names and the descriptions of their symbols are shown in the following table.

The total number of persons who cast their vote in the Chaguanas West By-Election, amounted to eighteen thousand, two hundred and ninety-nine (18,299). Thus, approximately 67.66% of those listed as qualified to vote, exercised their franchise. Of this figure, forty-five (45) or approximately 0.25% of the ballots cast were adjudged as rejected.

The total number of electors who qualified to vote as special electors for the Chaguanas West By-Election was seventy-nine (79) which is equivalent to 0.29% of the Electoral District's electorate. Of this number, only seventy-two (72) cast their ballots.

4. Results

The Interim Leader of the Independent Liberal Party (ILP) emerged as the winning candidate of the Chaguanas West By-Election, having secured twelve thousand, six hundred and forty two (12,642) votes or 69.09% of the polls. The candidate of the United National Congress secured the second highest with five thousand, one hundred and thirty (5,130) votes or 28.1003% of the total votes cast. The People's National Movement's candidate secured four hundred and twenty-six (426) votes; the Democratic National Assembly's candidate thirty five (35) votes; and the

candidate for the National Coalition for Transformation twenty one (21) votes. As a consequence, the latter three participants lost their deposits having each secured less than one-eighth of the votes cast.

5. Public Education and Publicity

Commencing with the Electoral Registration period, the Communications Unit of the EBC's Department mounted a public education and publicity campaign in which radio and newspaper advertisements were aired and published for the duration of the electoral registration. Subsequent to this, statutory newspaper advertisements were published with information that supported the electoral process, for the benefit of both the electorate and candidates. The original intention of the Communications Unit was to practise niche education and disseminate information to the electorate of the Chaguanas West Electoral District only relating to voting procedures. However, due to widespread attention of the election and the focus of the nation, information was disseminated via national media such as newspaper and radio. Press releases and letters to the editor were also published to inform the voting population of the voting process and also to avoid any possible miscommunication in the public domain.

6. Electoral Observation by the Commission

Electoral observation by the Commission commenced with visits to polling stations from 1:30 a.m. on polling-day. The early-morning visits, under police escort, were undertaken to the fourteen (14) venues embracing the total network of fifty-one (51) polling stations in order to observe their state of readiness, Presiding Officers and other election officers comprising the staff complement of polling stations having been told previously to have them in a state of readiness by mid-night before polling-day. With few exceptions, this instruction had been followed.

It was also observed that there were several instances of breaches of the law concerning actions aimed ostensibly at influencing electors to vote for a particular party by way of plethoric displays of party symbols within the boundary of a polling station delimited under the provisions of section 91 of the Act.

The contesting Parties' spokespersons branded this particular campaign with heat from the very onset, galvanizing their constituents to action geared towards absolute defeat of the other. It was a very stinging, bruising period of campaigning. The nation was gripped in the maelstrom of the offerings from the platforms of the prime protagonists contesting, targeting each other's principal contestants. There ensued a tense, highly-charged atmosphere nightly.

In response, commentators and columnists, priests and pundits of all stripes added their voices to restraint, calling on the combatants to exercise better judgement and circumspection in the manner of campaigning. It turned out to be a very hostile, bruising time for Chaguanas West and the display of former allies at each other's throats with animus was quite a spectacle.

The Commission separated into two groups for the observation of poll-day activity during the hours of 6:00 a.m. -6:00 p.m. All polling stations were visited.

In general it was found that the entire election process ran properly and smoothly.


