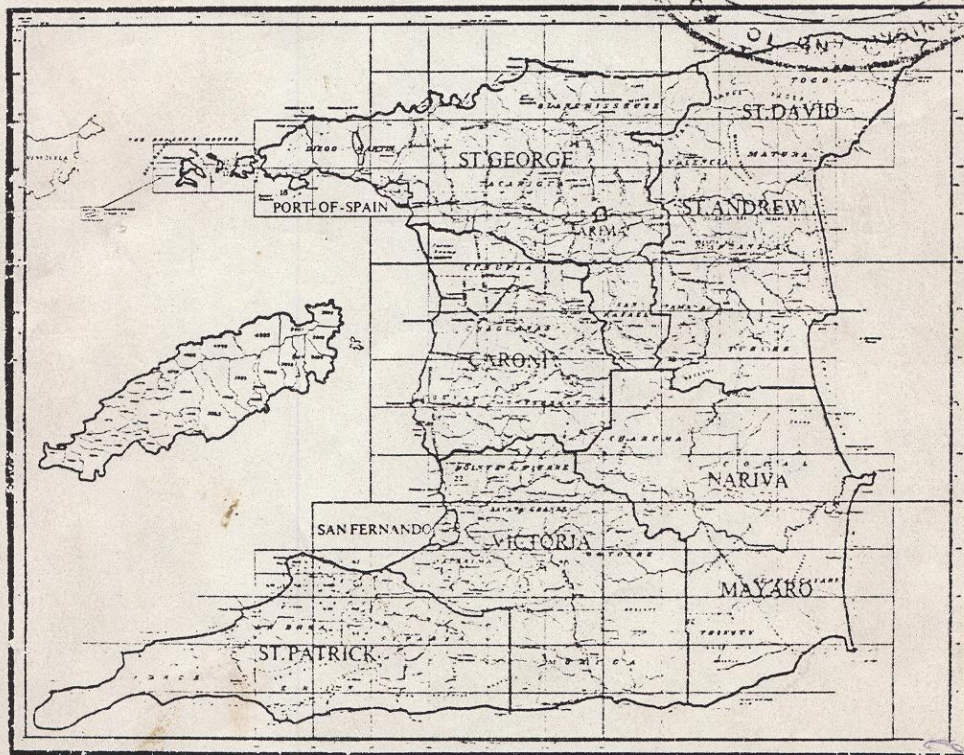

REPORT ON THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS, 1971

I. INTRODUCTION

In the execution of its statutory responsibility the Elections Commission, comprised of the undersigned members, exercised general direction and supervision over the conduct of the Local Government Elections held on Monday, 1st November, 1971, and enforced on the part of all election officers fairness, impartiality and compliance with the provisions of the Representation of the People Act, 1967.

2. Accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of Election Rule 97 (6) of the said Act, the Commission has prepared this its report on the said Elections, giving in particular :—

3. In addition, the Commission deems it fit to include the other information hereinafter contained which is supported by Tables 4 — 7 and Appendices I — VI.

4. It should be noted that the nomination of candidates and the Elections took place during the existence of a state of public emergency in Trinidad and Tobago.

II. DELIMITATION OF ELECTORAL DISTRICTS

5. On the 15th February, 1971, the Boundaries Commission for Trinidad and Tobago submitted its report recommending the boundaries of the several electoral districts into which each electoral area should be divided in accordance with the Boundaries Commission (Local Government) Act, 1967. The Boundaries Commission (Local Government) (Municipal Councils) Order, 1971, adopted the recommendations contained in the said Report that Trinidad and Tobago should be divided into twenty-seven Municipal and seventy-three County Council electoral districts distributed as follows :—

III. TERM OF OFFICE OF MEMBERS OF LOCAL AUTHORITIES

6. The Municipal Corporation Ordinances (Amendment) Act, 1967, as well as the County Councils Act, 1967, provides for the term of office of Councillors to be three years commencing on the day on which they are declared by the Returning Officers as having been elected to office. The previous Local Government Elections were held on the 24th June, 1968, and declarations were made by Returning Officers on the 25th June, 1968. The serving period of all Councillors, therefore, should have ended on the 24th June, 1971, by which time the new Councils would normally have been constituted.

IV. LOCAL AUTHORITIES - EXTENSION OF TERM OF OFFICE

7. In order that members of County Councils could legitimately carry out their duties beyond the statutory three-year period, the term of office of all serving Councillors was extended to a date to be specified not later than the 23rd day of October, 1971, by the Local Authorities (Extension of Term of Office) Act, 1971, assent to which was given by the Governor-General on the 22nd June, 1971.

8. Subsequently, by the Local Authorities (Extension of Term of Office) (Determination) Order, dated 7th October, 1971, the Governor-General specified the 19th day of October, 1971, as the date to which the term of office of all members of the Councils of the Local Authorities was to be extended.

9. The Local Authorities (Extension of Term of Office) Act, 1971, also gave authority to the Minister of Local Government to sanction the performance by Chief Executive Officers of County Councils and Town Clerks of Municipal Corporations of such of the duties and functions of a local authority as were necessary wherever, by reason of the inability of members of the Council or by reason of their failure to act whether by resignation or otherwise, the Minister considered it expedient to do so. This provision was actually applied and the appropriate legal instruments were issued in respect of Caroni, St. Patrick and Victoria County Councils in July, 1971, because of the retirement before the specified date of some members of these Councils.

V. VARIATION OF DATE OF PUBLICATION OF ANNUAL LISTS, 1971

10. The administrative and statutory duties following the Parliamentary General Elections of 24th May, 1971, left the Commission little time to publish the Annual Lists of electors in respect of Local Government electoral districts by the 1st July in accordance with subsection (1) of section 30 of the Representation of the People Act, 1967. In consequence, the Commission recommended the application of subsection (3) of section 30 of the Act for the variation of the statutory date of publication of the Annual Lists from 1st July to the 1st September, 1971. This recommendation was approved and the relevant Order was made by the Governor-General on the 26th June, 1971.

VI. PUBLICATION OF ANNUAL LISTS OF ELECTORS

11. The Commission duly published the Annual Lists of electors for all County Council and Municipal Council electoral districts on the 1st September, 1971. By the provisions of section 30 (2) of the Representation of the

People Act, 1967, the said Annual Lists of electors were deemed to be the Preliminary Lists of electors for the respective electoral districts.

12. The lists showed a total electorate of 436,145, made up as follows:—

VII. ELECTORAL REGISTRATION

13. In accordance with the provisions of section 31 of the Representation of the People Act, 1967, the Governor-General by Proclamations dated the 15th of September, 1971, fixed the 16th day of September, 1971, as the date of the commencement of the electoral registration for all Municipal and County Council electoral districts.

14. As required by Registration Rule 58, notices of electoral registration and copies of the Preliminary Lists of electors were posted on the 16th September, 1971, in two places in each of the polling divisions throughout Trinidad and Tobago.

VIII. TEMPORARY REGISTRATION OFFICES

15. Ninety-seven temporary registration offices were established to assist in effecting registration throughout the country. For the convenience of the public most of these offices operated a shift system which enabled them to transact business during extended hours. The offices were opened at 8.00 a.m. and closed at 8.00 p.m. on each working day.

IX. PHOTOGRAPHIC CENTRES

16. In addition to the already existing permanent centres thirteen temporary photographic centres were set up. A list of the temporary centres established and the number of photographs taken during the period of electoral registration appear at Appendices II and III respectively.

X. IDENTIFICATION CARDS

17. Every effort was made to have identification cards delivered to registered persons. Special appeals were made to the public over the radio, on television and through the press requesting that the cards be collected.

Posters were also prepared to emphasise the usefulness of the cards and to encourage registered persons to call for them.

XI. PUBLICATION OF REVISED LISTS

18. The Preliminary Lists of electors posted on the 16th September, 1971, were subsequently amended as required by law and this involved the addition of 3,165 names and the deletion of 1,012 others. The Revised Lists of electors were then prepared in the form prescribed and were posted on the 19th October, 1971, in the same places as the Preliminary Lists of electors. The total number of names shown on the Revised Lists of electors was 438,298 of which 74,024 related to Municipal Councils and 364,274 to County Councils. (Vide Table 2 and Appendix IV).

XII. ISSUE OF WRITS OF ELECTION

19. The Writs of Election issued by the Governor-General specified the 20th day of October, 1971, as Nomination Day, and the 1st day of November, 1971, as Polling Day.

XXI. APPOINTMENT OF RETURNING OFFICERS AND ELECTION CLERKS

20. Thirty Returning Officers were appointed to serve in the one hundred electoral districts and they received their appropriate writs on the 18th September, 1971. The Returning Officers nominated forty-five Election Clerks for appointment by the Commission. A list of these Returning Officers and Election Clerks is given at Appendix V. The Returning Officers and the persons selected as Election Clerks were trained in their duties by the Chief Election Officer and booklets containing detailed instructions were circulated to them. Lecture demonstrations were also given in each of the electoral districts to ensure that these officers had practical knowledge of:—

- (a) the new system whereby candidates are permitted to draw for the order in which their names should appear on the ballot labels; and
- (b) the method of inserting such ballot labels in voting machines.

XIV. NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES

there was only one person standing validly nominated and, in the circumstances, such person was immediately publicly declared elected, as required by Election Rule 15 (2). The Returns of Uncontested Election (Form 43) were duly forwarded for the information of the Commission and the appropriate endorsement made on the Writs of Election. All the candidates returned belonged to the People's National Movement.

(B) CONTESTED ELECTIONS

22. At the close of proceedings on Nomination Day fifty-eight persons filed their nomination documents, six in respect of the Municipal Council Elections and fifty-two in respect of the County Council Elections. The breakdown of candidates was as follows :—

(C) WITHDRAWAL OF CANDIDATE

23. In the case of the Poole/San Pedro Electoral District in which two persons had been validly nominated, Mr. Armin Mohammed, an Independent Candidate, withdrew his candidature within the prescribed time and the remaining candidate was declared elected in accordance with the provisions of the above-mentioned Election Rule 15.

(D) ACTUAL CONTESTANTS

24. As a result of the above withdrawal the number of candidates contesting the elections in the remaining twenty-six electoral districts was reduced to fifty-six made up as follows :—

XV. POLLING DAY STAFF

25. The Commission after considering the recommendations of the Returning Officers made the following appointments to the electoral staff:—

Most of these election officers had previously worked during the Parliamentary General Elections held on the 24th May, 1971. Nevertheless lecture and demonstration sessions on election day duties were arranged by the Commission in each of the electoral districts for their benefit.

XVI. APPOINTMENT OF CUSTODIANS

26. Eighteen custodians who had served during the 1971 Parliamentary General Elections were again assigned for similar duties by the Commission. The exercise of preparing the voting machines and the servicing of them on election day were carried out under the direction of the Supervisor, Machines and Master Lists.

XVII. PREPARATION AND TESTING OF VOTING MACHINES

27. During the first week in September, 1971, checking of the voting machines was commenced. However, heavy rains in the Arouca district on the 14th September, caused severe flooding of the voting machine warehouse

at the Golden Grove Prisons and some sections of the building came under two feet of water. This necessitated the removal of the machines to building "C 40" at Chaguaramas, and the Commission directed that preparation activities should continue thereat. In the course of transportation which was effected under police protection two voting machines sustained minor damage but this did not impair their efficient functioning.

28. In spite of the difficulties encountered as a result of the transfer to new premises the work of preparing the voting machines for the elections was completed by the 20th October, 1971, Nomination Day.

29. The Trinidad and Tobago Electricity Commission could give no guarantee that the supply of electrical power would be maintained throughout the country on election day. Accordingly, the Elections Commission directed that all voting machines should be operated manually. Contesting candidates and members of the public were informed of this decision.

XVIII. SELECTION OF POLLING STATIONS

30. Little difficulty was experienced in the selection of buildings for use as polling stations for the twenty-six contested electoral districts as most of the buildings used for Parliamentary General Elections were still available. One hundred and sixty-five buildings were selected as suitable.

XIX. POSTAL VOTING

31. The usual arrangements were made by the Commission for the exercise of postal voting to be carried out efficiently. Public notices were inserted in the daily and weekly press inviting the attention of persons eligible to vote by this method and giving the detailed addresses of the offices of the returning officers for the twenty-six contested electoral districts. As was done for the 1971 Parliamentary General Elections the Postmaster General appointed special agents to deal with the postal requirements under Election Rule 77 to ensure that all ballots arrived at the offices of the returning officers in time to be placed in the postal ballot box not later than 6.00 p.m. on Polling Day.

32. As only seventeen applications to vote by post were received by all the Returning Officers there was little difficulty in carrying out the provisions of Part IV of the Election Rules. Table 3 lists the number of postal electors in each electoral district.

XX. INSPECTION OF VOTING MACHINES

33. As required by law, the Elections Commission, by letter issued on the 22nd October, 1971, caused notice to be given to the Secretary of each political party having candidates to be voted for at the election and to each candidate contesting the election, that Monday, 25th October, 1971, at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon, at the Voting Machine Warehouse located in building "C. 40" at Chaguaramas was the time when and the place where the voting machines selected to be used at the elections to be held on Monday, 1st November, 1971, might be inspected by them.

34. On the appointed day representatives of political parties and independent candidates who were present at the Voting Machine Warehouse were permitted to inspect the voting machines and to observe that they had, subject to Election Rules 27 and 42(1) (c) to (g), been properly prepared for voting and were in proper condition and order for use at the election. Keys to each machine were enclosed in envelopes and appropriate certificates prepared in duplicate by the custodians.

XXI. DELIVERY OF VOTING MACHINES

35. The machines were despatched to the various electoral districts on the morning of Sunday, 31st October, 1971, in accordance with directions of the Elections Commission and all the units were installed safely and on time in the polling stations.

36. The distribution of the machines was as follows :—

37. All the machines were safely returned to the warehouse during the period 2nd to 3rd November, 1971.

XXII. POLLING DAY – 1st NOVEMBER, 1971

38. The procedure for the drawing of lots on the morning of election for determining the position of candidates' names on the ballot label which was introduced for the first time at the Parliamentary General Elections held earlier in the year was also followed in the Local Government Elections. The requirement of Rule 27(1) of the Election Rules, 1967, as amended by paragraph (4) of the Election (Amendments) Rules, 1971, was observed by all returning officers.

39. With a view to ensuring effective supervision of polling day activities, the Commission assigned its senior officers for special duty in each of the twenty-six electoral districts. Commissioners themselves undertook responsibility for the supervision of various areas and were readily available in electoral districts for advice or direction. They operated in cars fitted with radio phones in order to establish ready contact and to deal with matters of urgency.

40. Polling Day was quiet and uneventful. At two polling stations in the Endeavour Hindu School, the names of the candidates were inadvertently inserted on the ballot label in the wrong order. The Chief Election Officer, under the direction of a Commissioner, immediately arranged for voting to be stopped on the particular machines and for their replacement by spare units which had previously been selected and checked by the candidates. An immediate check revealed that totals of nineteen and seventeen votes respectively had been cast, and both candidates agreed that these votes should be included in the final count after the close of the poll.

XXIII. RESULTS

41. Results from the various electoral districts were received at the Central Electoral Office from 6.30 p.m. to 11.00 p.m. From the preliminary count the breakdown of the successful candidates was as follows :—

The final determination of votes held by the Returning Officers on the 2nd November, 1971, did not change the preliminary figures and accordingly a public declaration was made giving the names of all the elected candidates for the respective electoral districts. The results of the elections appear at Table 1. Other statistical data relating to each of the contested electoral districts appear at Tables 4 – 7.

42. The Honourable Minister for Local Government, Chief Executive Officers of County Councils and Town Clerks of Municipal Councils were notified of the results by official communication issued on 4th November, 1971, in compliance with Election Rule 97.

XXIV. DEPOSIT REFUNDS

43. All candidates save the independent who withdrew from the contest for the Poole/San Pedro seat qualified for refunds of their deposits.

XXV. EXPENDITURE

44. The expenditure as at 23rd February, 1972, aggregated \$409,949.34. This amount represents a decrease of \$134,754.74 when compared with the expenditure for the 1968 Local Government Elections. The items under which the various sums were expended are given hereunder :—
