REPORT ON THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS, 1977

I. INTRODUCTION

The Elections and Boundaries Commission hereafter referred to as the "Commission" in accordance with the powers vested in it under Section 71 (11) of the Constitution of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago, and the Representation of the People Act No. 41 of 1976, as amended by Act No. 20 of 1976 exercised general direction and supervision over the conduct of the 1977 Local Government Elections.

2. In this context and in conformity with the requirements of Election Rule 97 (6) of the said Act No. 41 of 1967, we, the undersigned, comprising the membership of the Commission, have caused to be prepared this Report on the elections containing the following particulars:

II. EXTENSION OF TERM OF OFFICE OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT BODIES

3. The triennial elections to the Municipal Councils and County Councils which were due to be held in 1974 were postponed in that year and in each of the succeeding years including 1976 for reasons which were given in Parliament when the Local Authorities (Extension of Term of Office) Act No. 33 of 1974, Act No. 48 of 1975 and Act No. 47 of 1976 were passed.

III. BOUNDARIES COMMISSION REPORTS - 1973 AND 1976

4. In 1973, the then Boundaries Commission, in accordance with the provision of Section 4 (1) of Act No. 18 of 1976 submitted its Third Report setting out the number and boundaries of the electoral districts into which it was recommended that Trinidad and Tobago be divided for the purposes of Local Government elections.

5. In keeping with the requirements of the said Section 4 (1) of Act No. 18 of 1967, another such Report fell due for publication not later than the third anniversary of the previous Report. This Fourth Report dated 20th October, 1976 was submitted to the Minister of Local Government. Following the submission of the Report, however, the Commission decided to set out into specific recommendations the suggestions made in the report of the 20th October, 1976. These were embodied in a document dated 22nd December, 1976 referred to as "Memorandum on the Fourth Report of the Elections and Boundaries Commission for the purposes of Local Government Elections."

6. The Fourth Report and more particularly the Memorandum thereon recommended significant changes both in councillor representation and in the political division of Trinidad and Tobago. They were subsequently circulated in Parliament.

**IV. BASIS FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE
1977 LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS**

7. Neither report however formed the basis for the electoral divisions of the country for the 1977 Local Government Elections.

8. The rationale behind the decision appears in the Resolution accepted by the House of Representatives on 14th January, 1977 when it was agreed *inter alia* that the elections would be conducted on the basis of the existing boundaries and existing number of seats so as to ensure that there would be no delay in the holding of the said Local Government Elections. The relevant parts of the resolution are quoted hereunder:

"Be it resolved that this Honourable House":—

- (1) Take note of the Fourth Report on the Elections and Boundaries Commission for the purposes of Local Government Elections which was laid on the Table on November 5, 1976;
- (2) Also note the Memorandum on the said Fourth Report of the Elections and Boundaries Commission which was laid at an earlier stage of the proceedings today;
- (3) Agreed that the forthcoming Local Government Elections shall be held on the basis of the existing boundaries and existing number of Seats so as to ensure that there would be no delay in the holding of the said Local Government Elections."

9. "The existing boundaries and existing number of seats" referred to in the resolution above were those established by the Boundaries Commission (Local Government) (County Council) Order, 1971, and the Boundaries Commission (Local Government) (Municipal Council) Order, 1971, on the basis of which the 1971 Local Government Elections were held.

**V. DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION
TO POLITICAL PARTIES**

10. Following Parliament's decision referred to above, the Commission took steps to provide all political parties, which had contested the 1976 Parliamentary Elections with complimentary copies of the Boundaries Commission Orders and the appropriate maps of the electoral districts. These were distributed together with a release containing general information at a meeting of representatives of political parties convened by the Commission.

**VI. PRELIMINARY LIST OF ELECTORS AND VARIATION OF DATE
OF PUBLICATION OF ANNUAL LIST IN 1977**

11. Section 30 (2) of the Representation of the People Act prescribes that the Annual List in existence shall be deemed to be the Preliminary List of Electors in the event that an election is called during the life of such List. These lists are required to be published on the 1st July of every year, or on such date as a Variation Order issued by the President may prescribe.
12. In view of the probability that Local Government Elections would have been held before the statutory date for publication of the Annual List, 1977, the Commission took steps to have the date of its publication advanced to 24th February, 1977, so as to provide an up-to-date List as a basis for the conduct of electoral registration. This was done through the issue of a Variation Order by the President acting under the provisions of Section 30 (3) of the Representation of the People Act.

VII. PUBLICATION OF ANNUAL LIST OF ELECTORS, 1977

13. The annual list for 1977 in respect of each polling division contained within the respective County Council, Municipal Council and Parliamentary electoral district was accordingly published and posted for public inspection in two places in each of the polling divisions to which they were related. Copies of the List were made available to political parties. The Lists recorded the total number of persons registered as electors for Local Government Elections as 581,501.

VIII. ELECTORAL REGISTRATION

14. The first legal instrument relating to the elections was the Proclamation issued by the President under Section 31 (1) and (2) of the Representation of the People Act which was published as Government Notices Nos. 33 - 42 of 1977. The Proclamation directed that an electoral registration be conducted in each of the Local Government County Council and Municipal Council Electoral Districts described in the Boundaries Commission Order, 1971, in which elections were due to be held and fixed 14th March, 1977 as the date of commencement of such registration.
15. In compliance with the requirements of the Proclamations the Commission established one hundred and twelve (112) temporary registration centres to serve the one hundred (100) electoral districts in which elections were to be held.

16. These centres operated daily from the date of commencement of the electoral registration to the day before the qualifying date and public notice of the days and hours of these operations was given in the Trinidad and Tobago Gazette and two daily newspapers.

17. Additionally a number of temporary photographic centres were established for the convenience of electors to facilitate the completion of their registrations.

18. The list of temporary registration centres and photographic centres and a Statement of the activities at these centres are set out in Appendices I and II.

IX. APPOINTMENT OF RETURNING OFFICERS

19. In the interim the Commission took steps to appoint Returning Officers to each of the electoral districts in which elections were to be held as provided for under Section 6 of the Representation of the People Act, No. 41 of 1967. The names of the Returning Officers and their Election Clerks who were subsequently appointed on the recommendation of the Returning Officer, appear at Appendix III.

X. ISSUE OF WRITS OF ELECTION

20. Writs of Election dated 19th March, 1977 were issued by the President in the names of the respective Returning Officers appointed by the Commission, setting April 13, 1977 as Nomination Day and April 25, 1977 as Polling Day.

21. The Writs of Election were handed to the Returning Officers at a Meeting convened by the Commission on 22nd March, 1977.

22. In the course of the Meeting they were advised of the duties and responsibilities which devolved upon them as Returning Officers.

XL PUBLIC NOTICE OF ELECTION

23. As required under Election Rule 4 (1) (a) of the Representation of the People Act, No. 41 of 1976, official public notice of the Elections was given in the Trinidad and Tobago Gazette and two daily newspapers in the Notice of Election published over the signature of the Returning Officer named in the Writs of Election.

The Notices advised the public *inter alia* of:

- (1) the location, hours of business of the office of the Returning Officer for the electoral districts; and
- (2) the dates set as Nomination Day and Polling Day.

XII. REVISED LIST

24. The Revised List was a departure from the usual format in that a completely new list incorporating all the subsequent changes in the preliminary list was not prepared. The Revised List on this occasion was comprised of the Preliminary List to which was appended a list of the names of persons therefrom and a list of the names of electors added thereto.

25. The use of this alternative method of preparing the Revised List reduced the number of days normally required for its preparation and could have the overall effect of reducing the period required for holding elections.

26. One complimentary copy of the Revised List for the electoral district was made available to each of the candidates nominated for such district. The list contained a total of 587,403 names of persons eligible to vote at the elections, which figure represents an increase of 5,902 names, over that contained in the Annual List, 1977.

XIII. AMENDMENTS TO THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT

27. The 1976 Parliamentary Elections indicated the need for certain changes to the electoral system to expedite the voting process.

28. The Commission, after considering all the available reports on the election and its own observations, submitted proposals for amendments to the Representation of the People Act most of which were designed to expedite the voting process. The recommendations were accepted and published as the Election (Amendment) Rules — Government Notice No. 48 of 1977. Such amendment provided *inter alia* for:

- (1) Dispensing with the use of the unit register except in special circumstances;
- (2) Redesignation of the functions of the Deputy Presiding Officer;
- (3) The replacement of a written declaration by an oral oath in cases where an elector did not present his identification card; and
- (4) The preparation of poll cards in original form only.

29. The effect of these amendments and other administrative arrangements will be dealt with later in the Report.

XIV. NOMINATION DAY

30. Two hundred and three (203) candidates presented their nomination papers to the respective Returning Officers in respect of the one hundred (100) electoral districts in the ten (10) electoral areas contained within Trinidad and Tobago.

31. In twenty-five (25) electoral districts candidates were returned unopposed. The electoral area of the Borough of San Fernando recorded the highest number of uncontested elections. All nine of the electoral districts had only one candidate nominated.

32. A list of the electoral districts in which there were uncontested elections appears below under the appropriate electoral area.

XV. TRAINING OF ELECTION OFFICERS

Returning Officers

33. Following their appointment, all Returning Officers were given two briefing sessions. They were also supplied with booklets of instructions,

a diary of the important election events and a copy of the Representation of the People Act. Supplementary instructions were also issued by the Commission from time to time.

Polling Day Staff

34. To ensure that polling day staff were fully conversant with their duties and in order to relieve Returning Officers of the responsibility of training, particularly those who were functioning in the position for the first time, to permit them to devote themselves fully to the other duties, the training of polling day staff was entrusted to Training Officers made up of senior officers of the Department and persons who had functioned previously as Returning Officers.

35. On the completion of their training the trainees reported back to their respective Returning Officers with whom rested the ultimate responsibility for recommending their appointment by the Commission.

36. The generally higher standard of performance by polling day staff appears to have justified this innovation by the Commission.

XVI. SPECIAL ELECTORS

37. Applications to be treated as special electors were received from the following categories of electors:

- (1) Members of the Police Service;
- (2) Residents of Tobago who would have been required to travel between Trinidad and Tobago to vote;
- (3) Members of the Elections and Boundaries Commission;
- (4) Persons employed as polling day staff in an electoral district other than that in which they were to be employed on polling day; and
- (5) Persons engaged in off-shore petroleum operations.

38. In the smaller electoral areas difficulty was experienced by some applicants in identifying the name of the electoral district corresponding to their address, and in consequence a few applications were misdirected. These were re-directed to the appropriate Returning Officer.

39. The number of names on the list of special electors in each of the electoral districts in which there were special electors is shown at Table 3.

XIX. DISTRIBUTION OF IDENTIFICATION CARDS

48. In its attempt to avoid delay at polling stations caused by electors presenting themselves to vote without their identification cards, the Commission undertook a house-to-house delivery to electors of the identification cards lying at Registration Offices.

49. The number of identification cards delivered in this manner was seven thousand, eight hundred and thirty-three (7,833).

XX. SUPERVISION OF CONDUCT OF POLL

50. For the purpose of exercising overall supervision of the conduct of the Poll, the Commission created four areas of supervision to which the Chairman, the two other members of the Commission and the Chief Election Officer were assigned. Other senior personnel of the department were assigned to assist the persons mentioned above.

These areas were:

TOBAGO

- (1) Commissioner Mr. Alexander proceeded to Tobago on the 21st April, 1977 to enable him to overlook the preparatory arrangements for polling day, the proceedings on polling day and the post election arrangements.

TRINIDAD

- (2) Dr. S. Moosai-Maharaj was assigned responsibility for the proceedings in the electoral areas of Victoria and St. Patrick;
- (3) Mr. A. L. Tyson, Chief Election Officer, overlooked proceedings in the County of St. George; and
- (4) Mr. Alan Reece, Chairman of the Commission, assumed responsibility for the remaining electoral areas.

XXI. POLLING DAY - 25th APRIL, 1977

51. Reports received indicate that voting commenced at the appointed time of 6.00 a.m. in all but two of the eight hundred and ninety polling stations. At one station - No. 1600B in the electoral district of Tacarigua - there was a fifteen-minute delay in opening the poli due to the non-arrival of the

XVII. PROVISION OF POLLING STATIONS

40. The exercise of obtaining suitable and centrally located buildings, preferably public buildings, to house the eight hundred and ninety polling stations which were established presented a problem to the Commission. This was caused by the legal requirement that a polling station for an electoral district must be located within that electoral district.
41. In a few cases the Commission had recourse to the use of private residences due to the non-availability or inconvenient location of suitable public buildings.
42. Advance copies of the information contained in the Notice of Taking a Poll were made available to candidates by the Returning Officers on the direction of the Commission.
43. The Commission gave due consideration to the representation made by political parties and individual candidates and their agents for the relocation of polling stations to a more convenient building located within the electoral district.
44. Wherever such requests were found to have merit and were not motivated by personal considerations the Commission took steps to resite the polling station and the public was advised accordingly.
45. The final selection of polling stations was made in collaboration with the respective Returning Officers.

XVIII. DISTRIBUTION OF ESSENTIAL SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT

46. The distribution of the essential supplies and equipment to Returning Officers in Trinidad and Tobago was effected on the following dates:

Tobago - 20th April, 1977. They were shipped by the Coast Guard and were accompanied by the Commission's Security Officer.

Trinidad - 22nd to 23rd April, 1977. These were despatched by vehicles of the Ministry of Works. Each vehicle was accompanied by an armed police escort.

47. As a security measure these items were distributed to the respective Presiding Officers on the 24th April and in some cases early on the morning of Polling Day.

Presiding Officer. The Deputy Presiding Officer assumed the responsibilities of the Presiding Officer and polling commenced.

52. The legal and administrative changes effected since the 1976 Parliamentary Elections contributed substantially to a speedier processing of voters and consequentially a more orderly conduct of the polls.

53. There were very few complaints of omission of names from both the unit register and the revised list of electors.

54. No complaints were recorded of any attempted or actual electoral impropriety and there were no reports of any untoward events within the confines of polling stations.

XXII. PRELIMINARY COUNT

55. Immediately after 6.00 p.m. Returning Officers proceeded to count the special votes cast at their Special Polling Stations to determine the result of the Special Poll. Results from the ordinary polling stations in the form of statements of the poll began to reach the offices of the Returning Officers as early as 6.30 p.m. In most of the electoral districts the Returning Officers had by 10.00 p.m. announced the total votes recorded for each candidate based on the preliminary count. The results for all the other electoral districts were announced by 12.00 midnight. These results were communicated to the Commission's Office at the Central Electoral Office, 107, Queen Street, Port-of-Spain, as quickly as it was possible to do so, by telephone or other means of communication.

56. Preliminary results for the seventy-five (75) electoral districts in which a poll was taken indicated the following distribution of seats according to party affiliation, People's National Movement - 44, United Labour Front - 26, Democratic Action Congress - 4 and Independent - 1.

XXIII. FINAL DETERMINATION OF VOTES

57. In accordance with the provision of Election Rule 92 (1) of Act No. 41 of 1967 as amended by Act No. 20 of 1976, the Returning Officers for the seventy-two (72) electoral districts in which no request for a count was received by 12.00 noon on the 26th April, 1976 confirmed the results of the preliminary count and made the prescribed declaration as to the candidate elected.

58. A count by the Returning Officer was conducted in the following electoral districts following the request of candidates:

1. South Western electoral district in the electoral area of

Arima;

2. Cocoyea/Ste. Madeleine/Cedar Hill in the electoral area of Victoria;
3. Hindustan/Tableland in the electoral area of Victoria.

59. In respect of (1) and (2) above the count was concluded on the 26th April, 1977 and the Declaration of the candidates elected was made on the same day. The count of the electoral district of Hindustan/Tableland was commenced and completed on the 27th April, 1977, and the Declaration was made on that date.

60. None of the counts conducted by Returning Officers altered the previously announced results.

61. The result of the election at each polling station together with the result of the special poll appears at Table 1. Other statistical data relating to the elections are contained in Tables 4 to 7.

**XXIV. REQUEST BY CANDIDATE FOR CHECK BY
CHIEF ELECTION OFFICER**

62. The Chief Election Officer received a written request from a candidate in the South Western electoral district in the electoral area of Arima, for a check of the result of the poll of that electoral district. The Assistant Chief Election Officer was designated to conduct a limited check of the questioned ballots as provided for under the provisions of Election Rule 96 (4) of the Representation of the People Act as amended. The candidates were advised of the date and time set for the check and they were invited to attend.

63. At the time appointed, after the Assistant Chief Election Officer had advised the persons present of the provision of the said Election Rule he was informed by the Returning Officer that there were no questioned ballots and this statement was confirmed by the candidates.

64. In the circumstances no check was conducted. The candidate who had originally requested the check then sought to have a recount of the ballots cast at the election in that electoral district. The request was however, not entertained since no provision existed for a recount in such circumstances.

XXV. NOTIFICATION OF RESULTS

65. As provided for under Election Rule 97 (6) of the Representation of the People Act No. 41 of 1967, the Honourable Minister of Local Government

and the respective Chief Executive Officers of the County Councils and the Town Clerks of the Municipalities were notified by letter dated 27th April, 1977, despatched by hand, of the names of the candidates elected. This was done to permit the holding of elections of aldermen within the prescribed period.

XXVI. DISTRIBUTION OF SEATS ACCORDING TO PARTY AFFILIATION

66. The distribution of seats according to party affiliations in respect of both contested and uncontested elections was as follows:

XXVII. EXPENDITURE

67. Details of expenditure on the election were not available at the time of the publication of this Report. There were, however, no extraordinary expenditure on supplies and services. Moreover, some savings are expected to accrue in respect of the amount estimated for the conduct of election in the twenty-five (25) electoral districts in which there were uncontested elections. This anticipated savings will, however, be reduced somewhat by the additional staff provided by the Commission for polling stations in those electoral districts in which elections were contested.

XXVIII. ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

68. The Commission wishes to record its thanks to the following:

- (1) Those members of the staff of the President's Office who at great inconvenience assisted in the arrangements with respect to the processing of the statutory instruments for His Excellency's signature;
- (2) The Government Printer and his staff for their continued cooperation in the printing of ballot papers and other election documents within the prescribed period;
- (3) The Police under Assistant Commissioner Mark, for their

effective security arrangements and other assistance provided;

- (4) Mr. Clive Sampson of the Ministry of Works and his staff to whom much of the arrangements with respect to the provision of equipment and the transport of supplies was entrusted;
- (5) The Postal Authorities for their assistance in effecting personal delivery of special ballot papers;
- (6) The Coast Guard for their co-operation in providing transport for equipment and supplies to and from Tobago;
- (7) The Boards of Management of Schools, Village and Community Organizations for making available their buildings for use as polling stations;
- (8) The news media for their cooperation in providing space for advertisements and other public information at short notice; and
- (9) The staff of the Elections and Boundaries Commission whose continued loyalty and dedication to duty has been so invaluable to the Commission in the discharge of its functions.
