REPORT ON THE PARLIAMENTARY GENERAL ELECTIONS, 1971.

1. INTRODUCTION

As required by paragraph (6) of Rule 97 of the Election Rules contained in the Third Schedule to the Representation of the People Act, 1967, the Elections Commission comprising the following five persons, namely:—

duly appointed by the Governor-General in pursuance of the provisions of Section 55 of the Constitution of Trinidad and Tobago, has prepared this its report on the Parliamentary General Elections, 1971, giving in particular:—

- (a) the number of votes polled for each candidate, by polling divisions and by postal ballot — vide Table 1;
- (b) the number of rejected postal ballots — vide Table 1; and
- (c) the number of names on the revised lists of electors — vide Table 2; and on the list of postal electors.— vide Table 3.

2. In addition, the Commission deems it fit to include the following information supported by Tables 4 — 8 and Appendices I — VIII.

3. The Parliamentary General Elections being reported upon were the second held in Trinidad and Tobago since the Country attained independent status and were conducted on 24th May, 1971.

4. With the experience derived from the Parliamentary General Elections held in 1966 and from continuous observation of the electoral system in operation, the Commission between 1967 and 1971 submitted specific recommendations for amendments to the laws relating to registration and elections.

5. In consequence of these recommendations the following changes inter alia were effected:-

(1) The Representation of the People Ordinance, 1961, as amended by the Representation of the People (Amendment) Act, 1966, was repealed and replaced with effect from 21st December, 1967, by the Representation of the People Act, 1967.

(2) The Registration and Election Rules contained in the Second and Third Schedules respectively of the last-mentioned Act were amended by-

(a) The Registration (Amendment) Rules, 1971, made by the Governor-General on the 4th May, 1971, and published as Government Notice No. 67, dated 5th May, 1971, and

(b) The Election (Amendment) Rules, 1971, made by the Governor-General on the 6th May, 1971, and published as Government Notice No. 70, dated 8th May, 1971.

6. The Elections Commission, mindful of the fact that there had been no complete house-to-house survey since 1961 when the system of Permanent Personal Registration was introduced, in 1969 directed the Chief Election Officer to conduct such a survey. The purpose of the survey was to enfranchise all qualified persons, to remove from the electoral lists the names of persons who had ceased to be eligible as electors, and ultimately to determine as accurately as possible the distribution of the electorate in the registration areas and registration units in the Country in order to assist the Boundaries Commission in the preparation of its Report.

7. The required survey was conducted over the period March 1969 to June 1970 concurrently with the programme for the substitution of Identification Cards issued during 1961 - 1963.

III. NUMBER OF CONSTITUENCIES

8. The Boundaries Commission Order, 1970, adopted the recommendations contained in the Boundaries Commission Report that Trinidad and Tobago should be divided into thirty-six constituencies. This left the number of

constituencies in Trinidad and Tobago unchanged from the previous Boundaries Commission Order under which the 1966 Parliamentary General Elections were contested. A Statement showing the constituencies and the registration areas within which they are contained appears at Table 4.

IV. GOVERNOR-GENERAL'S PROCLAMATIONS

9. On 22nd April, 1971, the Governor-General of Trinidad and Tobago issued Proclamation No. 7 of 1971 dissolving Parliament on the 22nd day of April, 1971.

10. On the same date by Proclamation No. 8 of 1971 the Governor-General directed that an electoral registration be conducted in all electoral districts and fixed the 23rd day of April, 1971, as the date of commencement of the said electoral registration.

V. ESTABLISHMENT OF TEMPORARY REGISTRATION OFFICES

11. Subsequent to the issue of Proclamation No. 8 of 1971 aforesaid, seventy-four temporary registration offices were established throughout the fifteen registration areas into which the Country is divided. A list of these offices appears as Appendix 1. A number of temporary photographic centres were also established. A list of these centres and of the number of photographs taken at them appear at Appendices II and III respectively.

VI. EMPLOYMENT OF TEMPORARY STAFF

12. Temporary Assistant Registration Officers were employed to carry out registration duties at various centres. The Commission also appointed Scrutineers as provided for under Section 5 of the Representation of the People Act, 1967.

VII. PUBLICATION OF PRELIMINARY LISTS

13. The Preliminary Lists of electors showing a total of 416,442 names of persons were published as required on 23rd April, 1971. In accordance with the provisions of Section 30 (2) of the Representation of the People Act, 1967, the Annual Lists of electors published on 1st July, 1970, were deemed to be the Preliminary Lists of electors.

VIII. REVISED LISTS

14. Due to the limited time - seven days -- between the end of electoral registration and the date for publication of the Revised Lists, the conventional means employed in producing the Revised Lists had to be supplemented by a typist pool which operated at the Convention Centre, Chaguaramas. The Revised Lists which were published on 10th May, 1971, contained a total of

454,541 names of persons qualified to vote -- an increase of 38,099 over the number contained in the Preliminary Lists of electors. This increase is accounted for by the changes notified to Registration Officers from the date of the publication of the Annual Lists of electors on 1st July, 1970, to the commencement of electoral registration, and the activity of the temporary Assistant Registration Officers during the period of electoral registration as reflected at Appendix IV. The names of the Registration Officers and the area to which they are attached appear at Appendix V.

IX. SELECTION OF POLLING STATIONS

15. The Commission appointed the following persons to make recommendations on the suitability of places for selection as Polling Stations:-

Mr. Victor Rique	- Security Officer, Elections and Boundaries Commissions
Mr. Clive Sampson	- Technical Officer, Ministry of Works
Mr. Clive Finley	- Cartographer, Elections and Boundaries Commissions

To ensure that the places selected were provided with electricity for voting machines, the assistance of officers of the Electrical Division of the Ministry of Works and the Area Engineers of the Trinidad and Tobago Electricity Commission was also obtained.

16. Wherever possible, public buildings were used as polling stations. Before voting machines were installed, the Commission had to be satisfied that strict security measures were taken and that the floor of the building was able to support the combined weight of electors and machines. It was also necessary to have an adequate supply of electrical power with suitably located wall outlets.

X. ISSUE OF WRIT OF ELECTION

17. The Writs of Election were issued by the Governor-General on the 23rd April, 1971, fixing Nomination Day as the 14th day of May, 1971, and Polling Day as the 24th day of May, 1971.

XI. APPOINTMENT OF RETURNING OFFICERS AND ELECTION CLERKS

18. Thirty-six Returning Officers were appointed. These comprised a retired Principal and two Officers in the Teaching Service, two retired Public Servants, twenty-eight Senior Officers employed in the Public Service, and two Town Clerks. Thirty-seven Election Clerks were also appointed to serve in the thirty-six electoral districts. The names of persons selected appear as Appendix VI.

19. Briefing sessions for the Returning Officers named in the Writs of Election were conducted by Senior Staff of the Central Electoral Office. The first of such sessions was held on Sunday, 25th April, 1971, and in attendance was the Chairman of the Elections Commission who addressed the Returning Officers on their responsibilities.
20. To assist in the training programme, the Registration Supervisors, North and South, were appointed to serve as Liaison Officers between the Central Electoral Office and each of the Returning Officers in their respective areas. This afforded a means of ready consultation for Returning Officers whenever any difficulties arose. This arrangement proved to be useful and effective.
21. Guidance notes, booklets of instructions, and a diary of duties were also prepared for the use of Returning Officers to ensure that they were conversant with their duties.

XII. NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES

(A) UNCONTESTED ELECTIONS

22. At the close of nomination proceedings in each of the following eight electoral districts, viz:-

there was only one person standing validly nominated, and in the circumstances, such person was immediately publicly declared elected, as required by Election Rule 15 (2). The Returns of Uncontested Election (Form 43) were duly forwarded for the information of the Commission and the appropriate endorsement made on the Writs of Election. All the candidates returned belonged to the People's National Movement.

(B) CONTESTED ELECTIONS

23. At the close of proceedings on Nomination Day there were sixty candidates nominated to contest the elections in the remaining twenty-eight electoral districts. The breakdown of the candidates was as follows:-

A list of names of the candidates nominated appears at Appendix VII.

24. Two candidates subsequently withdrew their candidature within the time permitted for such action under Election Rule 14. They were:—

- (i) Mr. Harnarine Singh, an Independent Candidate, nominated for the Electoral District of Chaguanas, and
- (ii) Mr. Carlton Celestine Reis of the Democratic Liberation Party, nominated for the Electoral District of Port-of-Spain South.

A Declaration in the form prescribed was received from each of the candidates by the respective Returning Officers and was duly transmitted to the Commission.

XIII. SELECTION AND TRAINING OF CUSTODIANS

25. Thirty-one technicians were recruited as Custodians, twenty-five for Trinidad and six for Tobago. Nine of these had no previous experience in the servicing and operational features of voting machines. They were therefore given a short intensive course of training prior to their assignment.

XIV. PREPARATION AND EXAMINATION OF VOTING MACHINES

26. Apart from the regular maintenance checks to which the voting machines were subjected, the Commission prior to the election directed that an up-to-date check be made on each machine to ensure that it was functioning properly. This was done under the supervision of the Commission's Chief Custodian and his assistant.

XV. PREPARATION OF MACHINES FOR ELECTION

27. In accordance with the requirements of paragraphs (1) and (2) of Election Rule 24, the trained custodians, on the direction of the Elections Commission, completed the preparation of the voting machines for use at the Election.

28. As required by paragraph (2) of Election Rule 26 as amended by paragraph (4) of the Election (Amendment) Rules, 1971, the Elections Commission, by letter issued on 15th May, 1971, caused notice to be given to:

- (i) The Secretary of each political party having candidates to be voted for at the election;
- (ii) Each candidate of such party; and
- (iii) Each candidate who was not a candidate of a political party.

that Thursday, 20th May, 1971, at the hour of nine o'clock in the forenoon, at the Voting Machine Warehouse, Golden Grove Prisons, Arouca, had been fixed as the date and time when and the place where the voting machines selected to be used at the Parliamentary General Elections to be held on Monday, 24th May, 1971, might be inspected by them.

29. On the 20th May, 1971, representatives of political parties and independent candidates who were present at the Voting Machine Warehouse were permitted to inspect the voting machines and to observe that they had, subject to Election Rules 27 and 42 (1) (c) - (g) as amended by paragraphs (4) and (10) respectively of the Election (Amendment) Rules, 1971, been properly prepared for voting and were in a proper condition and order for use at the Election.

XVI. POSTAL VOTERS

30. Applications to vote by post were received from members of the Police Service, Special Reserve Police, Supplemental Police, Trinidad and Tobago Defence Forces as well as from election officers. In some instances Returning Officers experienced difficulty in dealing with such applications, especially in cases where registration record numbers were not stated, and exhaustive search became necessary to trace the names of applicants on the lists of electors. A number of the applications could not be entertained, as the applicants had failed to give prior notification of their change of address to the appropriate Registration Officers. In consequence of this their names did not appear on the Revised Lists of electors for the electoral districts in which they claimed to be resident and qualified to vote.

31. At the request of the Commission and with the co-operation of the Postal Department a special courier service was established to facilitate the collection, distribution and return of envelopes containing postal ballot papers.

XVII. DELIVERY OF VOTING MACHINES TO POLLING STATIONS

32. During the period 20th to 22nd May, 1971, seven hundred and ninety voting machines were despatched under Police escort from the Warehouse and transported safely to the various polling stations and storage points throughout Trinidad and Tobago, and thereafter placed under security.

XVIII. PRESIDING OFFICERS, POLL CLERKS AND MACHINE ATTENDANTS

33. Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks and Machine Attendants were appointed by the Elections Commission on the recommendation of the Returning Officers. There was some difficulty in recruiting experienced personnel. In the circumstances, the Commission was forced to rely in some instances on the services of persons who had not worked previously but care was taken to allocate to the more responsible positions such persons as had worked at previous elections.

34. The training of Presiding Officers, Poll Clerks and Machine Attendants in their clerical functions was entrusted on this occasion to Returning Officers to whom a sufficient supply of booklets of instructions was issued for distribution to the three categories of polling station staff. Returning Officers

... were also advised that Senior Officers of the Central Electoral Office would be available, on request, to conduct or assist at training sessions. Requests made in this connection were all entertained.

35. Instructions in the manipulative functions of the voting machines were given by means of lectures and demonstration sessions conducted by experienced technical staff of the Elections Commission. At the end of each session every prospective appointee was given an aptitude test with particular emphasis on the removal and insertion of the ballot label and accompanying operations, since these were new functions.

36. Two training sessions were conducted by the Chief Custodian and his staff, at each of the following centres:-

and on the day preceding the election a final session was held at the Central Electoral Office, Port-of-Spain.

XIX. PUBLICITY

37. The Commission, in pursuance of its policy to keep the public informed, arranged for television appearances and radio broadcasts by Commissioners and Senior Officers when the following matters were dealt with:-

- (a) publication of the revised lists of electors;
- (b) the operation of the voting machines;
- (c) the innovation in procedure introduced by the Election (Amendment) Rules, 1971, with particular reference to the drawing for positions on the ballot label on the morning of elections;
- (d) election offences; and
- (e) avenues available to the public for communication with the Commission on Election Day.

The television appearances included demonstrations when necessary.

38. The Commission also arranged for releases to the news media on the above and other relevant matters.

XX. THE POLL

39. Polling Day, 1971, was to witness the introduction for the first time of the drawing of lots on the morning of election for determining the position of candidates on the ballot label. The relevant rule, No. 27 (1) of the Election Rules, 1967, as amended by paragraph (4) of the Election (Amendment) Rules, 1971, provides as follows:-

"Not earlier than two hours and not later than an hour and a half before the commencement of the taking of the poll the position of the candidates on the ballot label shall, subject to this rule, be determined by the drawing of lots".

47. In compliance with the provisions of Rule 97 (5) (b) of the Election Rules, 1967, the Chief Election Officer in writing notified the Speaker of the names of the candidates elected as follows:-

40. The requirements of this rule were observed by all the Returning Officers, except in one case where there was some delay in the drawing for positions. This, however, did not result in any corresponding delay in the opening of the poll at the prescribed hour of 6.00 a.m. The arrangements made by Returning Officers for notifying their respective Presiding Officers of the results of the drawing of lots functioned smoothly.

41. In some cases the insertion of the ballot labels was inexpertly done and it became necessary for the Commission to direct that the labels be properly refitted and seals replaced by custodians in the presence of the persons authorised to be present at such proceedings.

42. Reports of minor breakdowns of voting machines were received and were promptly investigated. Wherever necessary, remedial action was taken by custodians.

43. There was some delay in the progress of voting at polling stations where the Presiding Officers had no previous experience and were not sufficiently familiar with the operation of the unit register.

44. It was alleged that certain Presiding Officers refused to permit qualified electors to cast their votes in some cases. Investigations into these reports revealed that persons who complained did not satisfy the requirements for voting under the Election Rules. Moreover, in some cases, on the claimants' own admission, they were seeking on Election Day for the first time to ascertain their qualification to vote.

45. In order to exercise effectively its responsibility for the general direction and supervision over the administrative conduct of elections, the Commission assigned its members to various electoral districts. Commissioners travelled in radio-equipped police cars and this arrangement facilitated communication and ensured that complaints were given early attention.

XXI. RESULTS

46. Reports from the preliminary counts were received at the Central Electoral Office from Returning Officers from 7.00 p.m. on Polling Day to 12.30 a.m. on the following day. Returning Officers completed the final counts for each candidate and declared the results on the dates shown hereunder:—

48. The votes and percentages of votes cast for each of the parties and for independent candidates are shown at Table 5. Other statistical data relating to each of the contested constituencies appear at Tables 6, 7, and 8.

49. Nineteen candidates lost their deposits, two having withdrawn their candidature before the election and the other seventeen having failed to obtain one-eighth of the total votes cast in their respective constituencies.

XXII. EXPENDITURE

50. In the preparation for and conduct of the elections there was an expenditure of \$690,725.59. An analysis of the details of expenditure shows that there was an overall decrease of \$208,987.41 in 1971 when compared with the expenditure on the 1966 Parliamentary General Elections, notwithstanding substantial increases in the cost of materials and in remuneration paid to Election Officers. The decrease in expenditure was due to:-

- (a) uncontested elections in eight electoral districts; and
- (b) limited capital expenditure.

Details of expenditure are given at Appendix VIII.
