### REPORT ON THE PARLIAMENTARY GENERAL ELECTION, 1981

The 1981 Parliamentary General Election, the second such election under this country's Republican Constitution, was held on November 9, 1981 in the thirty-six (36) constituencies into which Trinidad and Tobago is divided in accordance with the Boundaries Commission Order, 1981.

2. In conformity with the requirements of Sub-rule (6) of Election Rule 108 made under the Representation of the People Act Chapter 2:01 (hereinafter referred to as "The Act"), the Elections and Boundaries Commission comprising the five (5) persons hereunder named:

OVERVIEW

4. The preparation for the 1981 Parliamentary Election commenced almost immediately after the 1980 Local Government Elections. The Local Government Elections were held on April 21, 1980. Unfortunately, the event referred to

as the "Guardian" Fire of April 27, 1980 gutted the Commission's Central Electoral Office at 107, Queen Street, Port-of-Spain, its main centre of operations, totally destroying the top floor on which were located the Commission's Photographic Laboratory, cameras and films in stock; the identification card processing section with its equipment and the Draughting Section with its stock of existing maps. Parts of the second floor comprising the Administrative Section were also destroyed, as well as the first floor, on which were located the machines leased from International Business Machines Corporation (IBM) for the purpose of computerising the registration records of the Department. On the Ground Floor, the plate files containing information, at Central Office level, from which the List of Electors was prepared, were substantially damaged by the corrosive effect of the salt water used in extinguishing the flames, with the result that efforts to restore these sensitive plate frames after permission was obtained to enter the building, were unsuccessful since most of them were found to be beyond restoration.

5. Some indication of the extent to which the Commission's operations were effected by the fire may be judged from the fact that the building was declared unsafe for use and was subsequently demolished. In consequence, make-shift accommodation had to be found both for the Commission and its administrative and technical operations comprising the Central Electoral Office.

6. In operational terms, the most serious effect was that not only did the Addressograph System of producing the list of electors cease to be functional as a result of the fire, but the commencement of the computerization of the records, an innovation which was intended to replace the Addressograph System, was itself delayed because of the need to replace the IBM machines which were destroyed or damaged by the same fire. The implications of this situation will be elaborated upon in a later section of this Report.

7. Notwithstanding the above, the Commission continued its preparation for the parliamentary election, which was interrupted only briefly by the Tobago House of Assembly Election held in November 1980. The progress was, however, restricted until suitable and sufficient accommodation was provided for the Commission and its Central Offices at the Salvatori Building. It was possible for the Commission to move into this new accommodation only in early December 1980.

#### PRE-ELECTION ACTIVITIES

8. Before the first legal instrument was issued, the Commission's preparatory work for the election was centred on three major areas of activity.

9. These were:

- (a) the preparation and submission of its Boundaries Commission Report recommending the number of constituencies and the boundaries of such constituencies into

- which Trinidad and Tobago was to be divided for purposes of Parliamentary Elections;
- (b) the preparation and publication of the Annual List of Electors on 1st July, 1981; and
- (c) the initiation of measures beyond the normal day-to-day operations which were designed to improve the accuracy of the existing List of Electors and to encourage the enfranchisement of all eligible persons.

THE BOUNDARIES COMMISSION REPORT

10. The last Report of the Elections and Boundaries Commission having been submitted in May of 1976, the Commission had a statutory responsibility to submit the next report not later than May, 1981. This was completed and submitted by the Commission to the Speaker and to the Prime Minister at separate meetings in May, 1981. The Report, while not recommending any increase in the number of constituencies into which the country was to be divided, effected substantial changes in the configuration and names of the existing constituencies. In fact, only three (3) of the constituencies created by the Boundaries Commission Order, 1976 were unaffected by the Commission's 1981 Report, namely:

Tobago East;  
Tobago West; and  
Toco/Menzanilla

11. The considerations which influenced the Commission's recommendations were indicated in the text to that Report. The Report was eventually presented by Government, without modification, in the form of a Draft Boundaries Commission Order which was subsequently approved by the House of Representatives. Following its submission to him, His Excellency, the President, acting in accordance with Section 7<sup>1</sup> of the Constitution made an Order, referred to as the Boundaries Commission Order, 1981, which Order was published in the Trinidad and Tobago Gazette as Legal Notice No. 83. The constituencies as therein defined formed the basis upon which the 1981 Parliamentary General Election was conducted.

12. Subsequent to the publication of the Order, the Commission published in a daily newspaper the list of polling divisions and the existing constituencies which had been affected by the 1981 Boundaries Commission Order. This was intended as a public notification of the new constituencies to which polling divisions had been assigned. In addition to its Report, the Commission also undertook the preparation of maps of the individual electoral districts.

Unfortunately, on this occasion the maps could not be obtained from the Lithographic Section of the Lands and Surveys Department, the traditional source, and arrangements had to be made for their preparation through another agency.

13. It should, however, be noted that information on the boundaries of the new constituencies was available to the general public as early as the 30th June, 1981, the date on which the Boundaries Commission Order was published in the Trinidad and Tobago Gazette.

14. Maps of the individual constituencies were subsequently made available by the Commission.

ANNUAL LIST OF ELECTORS

15. The Annual List of Electors was, in accordance with the provisions of Section 29 of the Representation of the People Act, published on 1st July, 1981.

16. The Commission had originally planned to produce the 1981 Annual List of Electors from the computerized records, but the six-month delay in the commencement of the processing of the registration data caused by the need to replace the destroyed and damaged machines and for the provision of alternative accommodation for the Central Electoral Office, made it impracticable to complete the exercise as planned.

17. Moreover, the competing demands for the use of Computer Time at the National Computer Agency caused the Commission to take the decision to find an alternative means of producing the Annual List, the Preliminary List and other lists so as to avoid the situation of not meeting its statutory deadlines.

18. The Commission consequently utilized the only course available to it, that is, the laborious typing of the lists directly from the unit registers and other subsidiary records, inasmuch as the plate files had been irreparably damaged in the fire.

MEASURES DESIGNED TO IMPROVE THE ACCURACY OF THE LIST

19. The Commission undertook the following programme of activities in the course of 1981:

- (1) A research project involving the selection on a random basis of two hundred registrants who were not located during the House-to-House Survey by Itinerant Assistant Registration Officers at the address recorded on their Registration Record Card.

This research project was designed to determine:

- (a) the accuracy of information from House-to-House Surveys;
  - (b) the pattern and circumstances of movement of registered persons;
  - (c) the frequency of such movement;
  - (d) the level of awareness of the requirements of the law to notify the appropriate Registration Officer of a change of address;
  - (e) the reasons for failure to take such action;
  - (f) the authenticity of the address given at time of registration; and
  - (g) frequency of use of identification cards.
- (2) A Registration Week programme conducted over the period 27th April to 2nd May, 1981. This was designed to promote registration throughout the country. Publicity was conducted along commercial lines by the use of posters, banners, advertisements over Radio, Television and in the Newspapers and other forms of media exposure. The programme was launched with a television talk by Commissioner, Mr. Simeon Alexander. A copy of the talk is reproduced at Appendix <sup>Sup 235</sup>
- Temporary registration centres were established in various parts of the country and both temporary and permanent centres operated throughout the 7 days of that week and remained open beyond the normal hours of business.
- (3) A National Canvass which was intended to reach every householder in the country and therefore had the potential to provide information on the status of every registered person in Trinidad and Tobago. The procedure adopted was the delivery of a form addressed to the head of the household with the request that it be completed by inserting the name of every member of the household and other pertinent information as indicated. It was to be returned within a given period.
- (4) House-to-House Surveys in all new housing areas and in areas where there was evidence of high internal migration.
20. The public response to these exercises which were conducted in an election year was disappointing. This may be judged from statistics on the two country-wide exercises, viz: the Registration Week Campaign and the National Canvass which appear below:

Statutory Instruments Related to Elections

ELECTORAL REGISTRATION

21. By Proclamation dated 14th August, 1981 and published in the Trinidad and Tobago Gazette, His Excellency, the President, directed that an electoral registration be conducted in each of the 36 electoral districts in Trinidad and Tobago as described in the Schedule of the Boundaries Commission Order, 1981. The Proclamation set August 17, 1981 as the date of commencement of such registration. This meant that the "Qualifying Date" for the election was 26th August, 1981. (Section 2 of the Act, refers).

22. Further, in accordance with the provisions of the registration rules, temporary registration centres were made available to the public over the period 17th - 25th August to register or to update their registration.

23. In keeping with its obligations under the Act and in order to provide all possible facilities to political parties and to eligible electors, the following action was taken by the Commission:

- (1) at least one temporary registration centre was established within each of the 36 electoral districts to serve that district;
- (2) a list of the centres established together with the electoral district that were intended to serve was published in 2 daily newspapers;
- (3) all political parties were notified in advance of the location of those temporary centres and advised of their right to nominate scrutineers to look after their interest at these centres;
- (4) the Annual List published on the 1st July, 1981 was, in accordance with Section 29 of the Act, deemed to be the Preliminary List for purposes of revision. Additionally, two copies of the list relating to each of the 1063 polling divisions in Trinidad and Tobago were posted for public examination within such polling division. The location of the building in which each such list was posted was published in the local newspapers; and
- (5) a copy of the complete set of electoral lists for Trinidad and Tobago was made available to all existing political parties to which symbols had been assigned by the Commission.

24. The Preliminary List posted was the same as the Annual List of the preceding 1st July and formed the basis for revision.

25. One hundred and six (106) such temporary centres were established to serve the thirty-six (36) electoral districts in Trinidad and Tobago. Only three (3) of the parties to which notifications were sent advising them of their right to name scrutineers responded to the invitation and in no case did a party nominate the total number of scrutineers available to it.

26. To avoid fraudulent registrations and other electoral impropriety, the 'bona fides' of all registrations and changes of addresses notified to the Commission during the electoral registration period were investigated before any amendment was made to the Registers and before the commencement of the preparation of the Revised Lists of Electors.

ISSUE OF WRITS OF ELECTION

27. Following the public announcement of the date and other details relating to the election made on Sunday, 11th October, 1981, the Writs of Election were issued by His Excellency, the President, on Monday, 12th October, 1981 to the thirty-six (36) Returning Officers who had been appointed by the Elections and Boundaries Commission to serve in the thirty-six (36) constituencies.

28. The Writs, which set the election within a twenty-seven day time frame, fixed Nomination Day as 26th October, 1981 and Polling Day as November 9, 1981. The Writs were returnable on 17th November, 1981.

29. During a short briefing session with the Returning Officers held on Monday, 12th October, 1981, the Commission impressed on them the need for impartiality and efficiency in the performance of their duties. The Writs were then delivered to the respective Returning Officers for endorsement and retention.

30. To assist Returning Officers, a time-table of important events was prepared for their guidance. A supply of the forms for which there was immediate need was made available to them.

31. The names and other relevant particulars of the thirty-six (36) Returning Officers - in whose names the Writs of Election were issued and who were appointed by the Commission in accordance with the provision of Section 6 (1) of the Act - appear at Appendix "4".

32. Guidance Notes and Handbooks of Instructions were also supplied to the Returning Officers during the period. Additionally, senior supervisory staff of the Commission were assigned to assist and advise Returning Officers in the performance of their functions.

Immediate Preparations for Elections

NOTICE OF ELECTION

33. Because of advance preparation by the Commission, it was possible to have most of the Notices of Election signed by the Returning Officers during the briefing session on the afternoon of Monday, 12th October, 1981 and to have all 36 copies published in at least one newspaper on Wednesday, 14th October, 1981.

34. The Notice of Election which is the first official public notification of a pending election in an electoral district gives 'inter alia' the date fixed for:

- (1) the preliminary examination of nomination papers;
- (2) Nomination Day;
- (3) Polling Day; and

/4) the address....

- (4) the address of the Returning Officer, the hours and days on which his office is open for business; and
- (5) the hours and day on which certain statutory functions will be carried out by the Returning Officer.

REVISED LIST OF ELECTORS

35. The Revised List of Electors was published and posted for inspection on 19th October, 1981. This list represented the updated information prepared by the Registration Officers based on the changes effected as a result of several exercises conducted by the Commission and finally those emerging from the electoral registration period.

36. The Commission considers it pertinent to state that the publication of the Revised List of Electors on 19th October, 1981 represented the fourth list of electors which had been posted in the country for public information in the 10½ months between December 1, 1980 and 19th October, 1981. They were:

The Annual List of 1980 published on December 1, 1980;  
The Annual List of 1981 published on July 1, 1981;  
The Preliminary List of 1981 published on August 17, 1981; and  
The Revised List of 1981 published on October 19, 1981;  
A Fifth List, the Supplemental List, was published on October 30, 1981.  
37. The Revised List and the Supplemental List to it contained a total of 736,104 names of electors.

38. An examination of the records shows that the Elections and Boundaries Commission through its several registration officers had, during the period referred to above, affected by means of additions, deletions and other changes, the sum total of 150,000 amendments to the list.

NOMINATION DAY - 26th October, 1981

39. At the close of proceedings on Nomination Day, a total of 157 candidates stood nominated to contest the 36 constituencies in Trinidad and Tobago. The distribution of candidates according to party affiliation was as follows:-

Each candidate was provided with one complimentary copy of the Revised List of Electors and of the electoral map relating to the electoral district for which he was a candidate.

40. There were three reports of failure of candidates to complete their nomination papers to the satisfaction of the Returning Officers by the prescribed hour of 3 p.m. on Nomination Day. Reports received from the Returning Officers were that the Nomination Papers presented by the prospective candidates were incomplete or deficient and, therefore, not acceptable. One of the candidates protested the decision of the Returning Officer to the Commission. The matter was considered by the Commission and the candidate was informed that the Commission had no jurisdiction in the matter, as it fell within the purview of the Returning Officer to decide such matters.

SELECTION OF POLLING STATION

41. The selection of over one thousand buildings for use as polling stations commenced shortly after the Boundaries Commission Order was published. The exercise involved:

- (1) selection of the required number of buildings, preferably public buildings, conveniently located and within the constituency which the polling station was intended to serve;
- (2) obtaining permission for use of the building from the competent authority; and
- (3) preparation of such buildings for use by the provision of chairs, tables and other necessary requirements.

42. In addition to considering the buildings previously used to determine whether a more convenient structure had become available since the last election, there was the major consideration of the substantial number of changes in the polling divisions within the several constituencies which necessitated changes in the location of polling stations. For example, the 1981 Boundaries Commission Order assigned 182 polling divisions to constituencies carrying names different from those to which they were assigned in the 1976 Boundaries Commission Order.

43. These changes in electoral districts did not in all cases involve changes in the location of the polling stations, but together with the other circumstances which necessitated such changes, for example, the unsuitability or unavailability of previously used buildings, resulted in 245,588 electors in 350 polling divisions being reassigned to vote at polling stations other than those at which they had voted at the 1976 Parliamentary Elections. The consequences of these reassignments will be considered later in this report.

44. The list of buildings recommended for use as polling stations was passed to the respective Returning Officers for their attention. Based on their reports, some changes were effected. The final list was then printed as the Statutory "Notice of Taking a Poll", which document contained the location of the polling stations for the constituency, the list of candidates nominated, their addresses, party affiliation and other pertinent information. A sufficient number of copies of the "Notice of Taking a Poll" was given to each of the candidates nominated, while others were posted in conspicuous places particularly on public buildings within the constituencies.

WITHDRAWAL OF CANDIDATURE

45. Following Nomination Day one candidate withdrew officially, within the period prescribed for such withdrawal, which is 5 clear days before Polling Day. This withdrawal reduced the number of candidates nominated in the electoral district of Diego Martin Central to 4 and action was taken to publicise such withdrawal. Inasmuch as the ballot papers had already been printed, an appropriate notice was put at the entrance to the relevant polling stations and the Presiding Officers notified each prospective elector of the fact of the candidate's withdrawal.

SPECIAL VOTING

46. The election time-table had set 30th October, 1981 as the last day for applications to be treated as a special elector, that is, persons who may vote before polling day and at special polling stations established for the reception of votes of such special electors, in accordance with Election Rules 73 and 76. Most of the applications received by Returning Officers came from the members of the Defence and Protective Services and from staff recommended to work at Polling Stations in constituencies other than those in which they were electors and from candidates and their agents.

47. Notwithstanding the assistance given by the Registration Officers and the Central Electoral Office in dealing with the applications sent to Returning Officers from these special electors, a number of applications were nevertheless eventually rejected by Returning Officers either for want of the required information, or where it was firmly established that the applicant was not registered as an elector in the electoral district in which he was applying to be treated as a special elector. As was the case with ordinary electors, these persons had changed their addresses and had failed to notify the appropriate Registration Officers of such removal within the prescribed period.

48. This was a clearly avoidable situation, however, as the Commission had taken steps, in collaboration with the Police and Defence Force Authorities, to have service personnel regularise their registration status before the election period. The response to its effort was considerably below expectation and in a number of cases the information arrived after the Qualifying Date and therefore too late for processing.

49. In the light of the problems which have arisen over the years in dealing with the applications of special electors within the usually short period available for special voting arrangements, the Commission has decided to apply the provisions of Election Rule 62(3) of the Act, using the recently held Parliamentary Election as the basic record for the change in procedure. In this way, all members of the Defence and Protective Services who applied and were accepted as special electors will be regarded, until their status is changed, as having been permanently accepted as special electors and they will not be required to apply to be treated as such for future elections.

/The Commission will.....

50. The Commission will periodically, and at least once in each year, after the publication of the Annual List, inform such electors of their status so that in the event of an election they would be provided with a ballot paper for the electoral district relating to their place of current residence. The Commission will also monitor the status of these persons through the relevant Employer so that as soon as they cease to qualify as special electors their names will be removed from the list. This will be repeated at all future elections, so that eventually the list of special electors of the Defence and Protective Services will contain all eligible members, except the new intakes between elections.

51. It is hoped that this innovation will reduce the problems experienced with Special Voting.

52. The Commission in its summary recommendation will deal with the question of broadening the categories of Special Electors which, from experience, appears to be necessary.

ESTABLISHMENT OF SPECIAL POLLING STATIONS

53. Special Polling Stations were established by each of the 36 Registration Officers at their respective offices for the use of special electors for their electoral district.

54. Additionally and in accordance with the requirements of Election Rule 76 (2), Special Polling Stations were established by the Commission in different parts of the country where special electors could vote without regard to their electoral district.

55. These special polling stations were established at:

- (1) Off-shore platforms for persons engaged in off-shore petroleum operations;
- (2) At hospitals - for patients at these institutions;
- (3) In Trinidad for electors eligible to vote in a constituency in Tobago and vice versa; and
- (4) At Police and Defence Force Headquarters and out-stations for service electors.

ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS ISSUED RE SPECIAL VOTING

56. Because of reservations expressed in certain quarters regarding the secrecy of voting at special polling stations operated for service electors, special instructions were issued in which it was explicitly set out that the envelope containing the ballot (ballot paper envelope) and the envelope in which it was to be further enclosed (Declaration of Identity envelope) were both to be sealed with an adhesive provided, if required, by the Special Presiding Officer and thereafter placed in the special ballot box by the special elector.

57. It is hoped that these procedures which were implicit in previous instructions have cleared up any existing doubts or suspicions on the subject.

PUBLICATIONS BY THE COMMISSION

58. The Commission published in the course of the year Revised Editions of the following documents for the information of political parties and election officers:

- (1) 'Handbook for Candidates and Election Agents', which was originally distributed to representatives of political parties at a meeting called by the Commission and subsequently made available to all nominated candidates and their election agents;
- (2) Booklet of Instructions for Returning Officers; and
- (3) Booklet of Instructions for Polling Station Staff.

59. A Series of Guidance Notes was also issued to Returning Officers by the Chief Election Officer outlining the procedure for dealing with the main events of the election in which they were involved as Returning Officers.

INTRODUCTION OF A SUPPLEMENTAL LIST OF ELECTORS

60. The Act provides that an elector is eligible to vote if his registration record card appears in the unit register and/or if his name is on the Revised List of Electors.

61. The Act made no provision, however, for the inclusion of a name on the Revised List if inadvertently omitted. This could be remedied only by the inclusion of the registration record card in the Unit Register which would satisfy the requirement for voting.

62. The Commission, however, was of the view that whereas an objection to the inclusion of a name on the List of Electors could be made before the election, the inclusion in the Unit Register provided no such opportunity other than at a polling station on polling day. To facilitate amendments to the Revised List arising from "bona fide" changes or other information notified to the Commission within the prescribed period, the Commission recommended and Cabinet approved the preparation and publication of a Supplemental List of Electors, such List to be published at least 10 days before Polling Day. Provision was also made for objection to be made to any name appearing on such list.

63. These provisions were effected by an appropriate amendment to the Registration Rules which was published in the Trinidad and Tobago Gazette and the two daily newspapers. It will be noted that this Supplemental List represented yet another list - the fifth - published for public scrutiny between December 1, 1980 and October 30, 1981.

64. This Supplemental List contained the names which for one reason or another had been omitted from the revised list. For example, the names of persons who had not completed their registration, those who had made claim for inclusion and whose "bona fides" had not been established up to the time of the printing of the Revised List and the names of other persons who after examining the Revised List of Electors had advised the Registration Officer of the omission of their names.

/This Supplemental List.....

65. This Supplemental List, which constituted part of the revised list used at the polling stations, contained a total of 3,972 names. Copies were made available to all candidates free of cost.

66. It was indeed surprising therefore that in spite of all these facilities there were still persons who had up to the time of publication of the Supplemental List taken no action whatsoever to enquire into and ensure the validity of their registration status.

RECRUITMENT AND TRAINING OF POLLING DAY STAFF

4 VPPS  
67. The arrangements associated with the recruitment and training of approximately 4,000 persons in different parts of the country for the one-day assignment at polling stations produced more than the usual number of problems on this occasion. Recruitment commenced before the date on which the election was announced by advertisements in the daily newspapers inviting persons to apply to the registration officer of their area for employment as Presiding Officers, Deputy Presiding Officers and Poll Clerks.

68. The few applications received in response, following the announcement of the election, were passed to the appropriate returning officers who were entrusted with the recruitment of staff for their polling stations.

69. Reports received from returning officers indicated that many of the experienced personnel were reluctant to accept assignment, giving as the reason the fact that in addition to the work being responsible, it was onerous in that it required that they be at their station from 5 a.m. on 'polling day' until at least 7 p.m. Others attributed their reluctance, in part, to the remuneration of \$100.00, \$95.00 and \$60.00 provided for Presiding Officers, Deputy Presiding Officers and Poll Clerks, respectively, being insufficient.

70. The problem was more acute in certain areas than in others.

71. In the face of this situation, the Commission felt compelled to increase the number of voters to a polling station and to introduce innovations in procedures, which eventually, proved to be very effective. Details of these measures introduced will be outlined in this report under "Polling Day".

72. The training of polling day staff recruited was undertaken by the Returning Officers assisted by the senior officers of the Department. Each senior officer was assigned to a group of returning officers to liaise with the Chief Election Officer and to advise and assist.

73. Additionally, the Commission recruited the services of a retired Assistant Chief Election Officer, Mr. Charles Mahabir, to assist in the training of staff and to give advice and assistance to the less experienced Returning Officers.

74. Returning Officers were directed to hold not less than 3 lecture sessions for polling day staff, whether experienced or not. Subsistence and travelling allowances were paid to all who attended the lecture sessions.

/SUPERVISION OF POLL BY COMMISSION.....

SUPERVISION OF POLL BY COMMISSION

75. The Police made available radio equipped police cars to Commissioners and senior administrative officers of the Commission to enable them to assist in the supervision of the poll throughout the country. Commissioners Mr. K. de la Bestide, Mr. D. Wilson and Mr. S. Alexander overlooked field operations in the north, south and Tobago, respectively, while the Chairman coordinated operations from the Central Electoral Office.

POLLING DAY NOVEMBER 9, 1981

PROCEEDINGS ON POLLING DAY

76. There was no report of any undue delay in the opening of the poll at 6 a.m. in the 1,210 polling stations established in Trinidad and Tobago. All the essential requirements for the conduct of the poll were supplied to the Returning Officers and were available at the polling stations.

77. There was one change in the published location of a polling station in the electoral district of Tabaquite. The Returning Officer had indicated that the area assigned for operation of the polling station in the compound of the Post Office, Williamsville, was unsuitable. Moreover, for security reasons the presence of a polling station operating simultaneously with a post office was felt to be undesirable.

78. As a building was available at the adjoining premises, it was decided to re-locate the polling station at such building and to notify the candidates accordingly. The notification of the change was also published in the newspapers on polling day apart from being posted on the building.

79. Reports were received in the course of the morning that there was an operating liquor establishment in the building being used as the polling station. The area was visited by the Chief Election Officer who ascertained that the liquor establishment was not operating and was in fact closed, as required by law, moreover, there was no connection between that part of the building in which voting was being conducted and the part in which the liquor establishment normally operated and voting was being conducted in an orderly manner.

80. The Presiding Officer, when interviewed by the Chief Election Officer who visited the scene, stated that she had no complaints about the location of the polling station.

81. It is worthy of mention that there was no report of intimidation, personation or any of the polling day offences falling under the category of corrupt or illegal practices. There was also no report of violence.

82. Protest letters were received from two candidates who contested the electoral district of Barataria. One complained about the inadequacy and unsuitability of polling stations and the other about the appointment of persons who had campaigned openly against the writer. Investigations were conducted into the letter complaint but there was no available evidence to support any allegation of impropriety on the part of the appointees in the performance of their duties.

83. By 6.15 p.m. all persons who were within the compound at 6 p.m. had been attended to, the poll was closed and the count commenced after the usual procedures. The count was completed between 7 p.m. and 8 p.m. and the Duplicate Statements of the Poll, the ballot boxes and other polling station documents were received by the returning officers between 7.15 p.m. and 9 p.m. Immediately following the receipt of the Duplicate Statement of the Poll, the Returning Officers announced the result of the preliminary count for their respective districts.

84. The early completion of the preliminary count, the special arrangements made by the media for communicating the results from the offices of the returning officers and the availability of a copy of the Statement of the Poll to each polling agent, made it possible for the results of the poll to be known throughout the country by 9 p.m. on election night.

RESULTS OF THE POLL

85. In keeping with the provision of Election Rule 101 (1) of the Election Rules, the 36 Returning Officers made their declaration of the results of the Poll after 12 noon on 10th November, 1981, inasmuch as there was no request from any candidate for a check of the results of the poll by 12 noon on that day. The candidates and the Chief Election Officer were accordingly officially notified by the Returning Officers.

86. The party affiliation of the successful candidates was as follows:

P.N.M.	26
U.L.F.	8
D.A.C.	2

87. Of the 157 Candidates nominated, 73 failed to get more than the required 1/8 of the votes cast in their constituencies and their deposits were accordingly forfeited.

RETURN AS TO CANDIDATES ELECTED

88. In compliance with the provisions of Election Rule 108 (1), the 36 Returning Officers made their Returns on the 17th November, 1981, the 7th day next after the Declaration of the results. All election documents were also delivered to the Chief Election Officer on the said date. Publication of the results of the election was made in the Trinidad and Tobago Gazette on 17th November, 1981 and the list of candidates elected was also notified by the Chief Election Officer to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, in accordance with the provision of Election Rule 108 (5) (b) (1).

VALIDITY OF PUBLIC COMMENTS AND CRITICISMS ON THE CONDUCT OF THE ELECTION

89. In the light of the comments which the conduct of the elections and other associated arrangements have evoked in certain quarters, it is considered necessary to set out the facts and in so doing to refute where necessary, some of the inaccurate statements which have been made locally and overseas.

/Most of the.....

90. Most of the criticisms and comments have been centred on:

- (1) The alleged slowness of the voting process at some polling stations and the consequential frustration experienced by voters, some of whom it was alleged did not remain to cast their votes; and
- (2) The number of persons who were in possession of identification cards and who claimed to be qualified to vote at certain polling stations but who allegedly were unable to vote at such stations for the reason that their names did not appear on the revised list for the relevant polling station.

91. Visits to some polling stations in the course of the early morning period confirmed that there were long lines of electors and that the voting rate was inordinately slow. In consequence, there was some deterioration in the standard of orderliness associated with polling stations.

92. In actual fact, the Commission took adequate steps to prevent such a situation.

93. Because of the increase in the number of electors per polling station, the reason for which was indicated under 'Recruitment and training of polling day staff', consideration was given to the measures which could be employed to cope with such increase without slowing down the voting process.

94. The procedures decided upon provided an adequate solution to the situation and at a special meeting called with the returning officers on Friday, 6th November, 1981 at the Port-of-Spain Town Hall, the procedures were fully explained and the Returning Officers were directed to communicate same to their presiding officers.

95. In deciding upon the procedures, the Commission, in the light of its experience identified five stages in the voting process:

- (1) the location of the voter's name on the list of electors;
- (2) the location of his pre written poll card;
- (3) the affixing of the elector's signature or thumb impression on his poll card;
- (4) the taking of an oath in the case of an elector without his identification card; and
- (5) the location of an elector's registration record card in the unit register when his name did not appear on the list or he did not present his identification card.

96. Previously the elector was required to wait in line until he had reached the recording poll clerk before action could be taken in respect of (1) - (4) and until he had reached the Presiding Officer before action could be taken on (5).

/It was therefore.....

97. It was therefore decided that the solution to the problem was the provision of an extra poll clerk in addition to the normal polling station team of 3 - (Presiding Officer, Deputy Presiding Officer and Poll Clerk) and the provision of 2 voting booths per polling station.

98. This additional poll clerk was expected to proceed down the line of waiting voters and to complete the procedures described at (1) - (4) while the Deputy Presiding Officer would deal with the procedure detailed at (5). In this way, the Recording Poll Clerk and the Presiding Officer would have had a steady stream of electors, inasmuch as most of the processes would have been completed in advance before reaching him. This was intended to allow for the faster issue of ballot papers by the Presiding Officer and thereby facilitate the casting of their ballots by 2 voters simultaneously in the 2 voting booths provided.

99. Wherever this procedure was carried out, the voting process was considerably speeded up and there was no cause for complaint.

100. Unfortunately, these instructions although reportedly conveyed by Returning Officers to Presiding Officers were not followed in a number of cases, in that the additional poll clerk and the Deputy Presiding Officer remained seated at the table and it was only after supervisory staff or the returning officer introduced the stipulated procedures that the situation was corrected.

101. The innovation of one additional poll clerk and a second voting booth demonstrated the extent to which the voting process could be expedited and the time for voting per elector reduced by almost 40%. This was therefore useful as a guide for future elections.

With respect to 2

102. Before attempting to deal with this matter which has been the subject of much comment, the Commission invites attention to the following information which is necessary for arriving at an informed view on the conduct of the election:

- (a) the Commission's earnest efforts to have citizens verify and/or correct their registration status in the course of the year and more particularly between December, 1980 and the date of the commencement of electoral registration;
- (b) the system of registration in operation by the Commission is voluntary and one in which there are no sanctions for non compliance. In fact Section 16 (3) of the Representation of the People Act specifically prescribes:

"Nothing in this Act shall be construed as making it obligatory for any person to be registered under this Act or as subjecting a person not registered under this Act to a penalty for failing to furnish an election officer with information relevant to his registration under this Act".

/(c) notwithstanding .....

- (c) notwithstanding several reminders issued by the Commission, many citizens overlooked the fact that the last day for registration or effecting changes to one's registration was the 25th August, 1981 and that the qualifying date for the election was the 26th August, 1981, and attempted to take action after those dates;
- (d) the level of accuracy which a computerized list would have achieved was not possible by the manual method employed. The delay in embarking on the computerization programme caused by the fire of April, 1980 which destroyed the Commission's premises at Queen Street, Port-of-Spain has already been indicated;
- (e) over 50% of the voters at the election in the age group 18 - 20 years were registered through the Commission's initiative while still at school and below the voting age. They were subsequently automatically enfranchised upon attaining the age of 18 years; and
- (f) the almost total updating of the registration of all persons in housing developments in various parts of the country by means of House to House Surveys.

103. In the light of the above, the Commission was convinced that the allegations of disenfranchisement of eligible voters due to mass omissions was a misrepresentation of the facts.

104. There was, however, ample evidence that names of a substantial number of persons who presented themselves to vote at polling stations on election day did not appear on the revised list for that station.

105. The Commission, therefore, in its attempt to identify the circumstances which accounted for the situation described in the preceding paragraph conducted an investigation involving a cross section of the election officers who were confronted with that situation on Polling Day.

106. These included:

- (1) Presiding Officers at some of the Polling Stations visited by these persons;
- (2) Returning Officers who had responsibility for the conduct of the election in the electoral district and to whom the Presiding Officers would have submitted reports; and
- (3) Registration Officers whose offices in some areas were visited by crowds of persons attempting to determine their registration status and/or the location of their polling stations on polling day.

/The Commission also.....

107. The Commission also directed attention to the comments and criticisms expressed publicly on the conduct of the elections and in particular the reasons for such views.

108. The result of this investigation provided the Commission with useful information on the situation and merits being placed on record in the light of the uninformed views which have been expressed on the subject.

109. Set out hereunder are:

- (1) a list of the categories of persons who presented themselves to vote but were ineligible for the reasons indicated; and
- (2) the circumstances which accounted for some persons not being qualified to vote.

CATEGORIES

110. (1) Persons born before 3rd May, 1955 and who were registered as non-electors and failed to re-register as electors. Such persons could not be deemed to be electors inasmuch as the relevant provisions of the Act did not apply to persons who had attained the age of 21 years before 3rd May, 1976. Many of these persons, however, had the non-elector identification cards in their possession and presented themselves to vote.
- (2) Persons whose names had been removed from the list of electors as a result of their change of residence and their failure to notify the registration officer of their new address. A number of such persons presented themselves to vote either at the polling station of their old address or that of their new address.
- (3) Persons affected by the changes in location of polling stations who proceeded to the polling station at which they voted at the previous election without checking the 'Notice of Taking a Poll' which gave the location of their new polling station. It will be noted that there were 350 such changes in the polling stations affecting 245,588 electors.
- (4) Married women who were registered in their maiden names and took no steps to re-register but who presented themselves to vote in their married names, which names did not appear on the list of electors.

/(5) Persons who.....

(5) Persons who were not located at their registered address during House-to-House Surveys conducted by Itinerant Assistant Registration Officers of the Commission and whose registration had subsequently been cancelled after there was no response to:

- (1) Enquiry Forms; and
- (2) "Notices of Intended Cancellation" forwarded to them by the Registration Officer.

CIRCUMSTANCES

111. (1) The fact that a number of persons were moved to enquire or take action on their registration only at the height of the election campaign and after the registration period had passed.
- (2) Reported instances of agents of candidates operating outside the compound of the Polling Station, advising prospective voters deliberately or otherwise that their names did not appear on the list of electors, and the acceptance by such persons of this information without verification at the Polling Station.
- (3) Because of the widely held view that the mere possession of an identification card entitled a person to vote whether or not his name appeared on the list of electors or in the unit register of electors, a number of persons who had moved into new districts and had taken no action to inform the registration officer, nonetheless, presented themselves to vote at the polling station related to their current place of residence.
- (4) The erroneous opinion that notwithstanding that a person did not notify the Commission of a change of residence his name would appear permanently on the List of Electors even though he may have removed to another area and become qualified to vote in that area.

112. The un-cooperative attitude of some electors to the Commission's appeal to check the list of electors and to establish the polling station to which they were assigned is graphically illustrated by the case of the prospective voter who, after being informed that his name did not appear on the list at the polling station he visited, proceeded to the registration office to complain that his name had been "left out". When asked, however, how he knew that he had visited the correct polling station, his reply was that it was the one nearest to his home. Enquiries however, disclosed that it was not his polling station and he was accordingly directed to the correct one.

/The Commission readily.....

113. The Commission readily concedes that there may have been instances of human error which probably resulted in omissions of names or the assignment of names to wrong polling divisions.

114. In making this concession the Commission wishes to point out that through the several exercises extending from Registration Week to the publication of the supplemental list, it processed approximately 150,000 amendments, that is, additions and deletions to the existing list of electors.

115. The magnitude of this assignment may best be understood when it is noted that the Revised List published in October 1981 showed an increase in the electorate of 45,645 over that reflected in the Annual List of December 1980. This was achieved in a situation in which the original equipment for processing changes had been destroyed by the 'Guardian' fire and the computerized system was not yet operational.

GENERAL COMMENTS

116. The events of the 1981 Parliamentary Election have served to reinforce the Commission's long held view that so long as the electoral system recognizes explicitly the right of the citizen not to participate in the electoral process, and there is no provision for him to be registered or to regularize his registration status on polling day, then irrespective of the efforts of the Commission and other agencies there will always be the more lackadaisical of citizens who will be moved to attempt to participate only after the date on which registration for election has ceased.

117. If the 'status quo' is not to be retained and radical changes are to be introduced, then the options open are the introduction of compulsory registration, with appropriate sanctions, either with or without the complementary arrangement of compulsory voting—since registration is primarily for the purposes of voting—or to permit the disfranchisement of persons at any time up to and including polling day.

118. For reasons which follow, the Commission supports neither of these arrangements.

COMPULSORY VOTING

119. In considering compulsory registration, the Commission has accepted the view of some social scientists, that the failure to register is usually indicative of a sense of irresponsibility, of alienation or of extremism reflected in a rejection of the conventional system.

120. To force an irresponsible person or an extremist to register and thereafter to vote could result in:

- (1) the exercise of his vote irresponsibly or not at all, such as is reflected in unmarked ballots or those marked in a form that makes their rejection necessary; or

/ (2) the support of.....

(2) the support of extremist elements in the society.

REGISTRATION ON POLLING DAY

121. However popular and convenient this may appear to be, it opens the door wide to electoral impropriety, violence, disorderliness, chaos and litigation, situations which so far have been avoided under the existing system. Moreover, this arrangement would convert the polling station into both a registration and voting centre.

122. The case against the adoption of such a measure is persuasively put by Professor Harris in his book on "Registration of Voters in the United States of America".

"The value of registration is largely lost if some provision is made whereby the unregistered voter may swear in his vote at the polls, when there is no time or opportunity to investigate the case. Provisions of this kind frequently break down in critical elections, especially in the machine-controlled precincts where there is danger of fraud. Eleventh-hour special appeals for registration, when it is too late for investigations to be made, also work badly. These provisions may be necessary or can be defended under registration systems which provide only a few days for registration, for bona fide voters may be away during those particular days, but under a system of permanent registration conducted throughout the year, where the voter is normally required to register only once, little defence can be made".

123. When all the implications of such an arrangement are considered, this seems to be the less acceptable alternative.

124. The Commission, having assumed the rejection of the more radical approach, while accepting the fact that changing conditions demand that refinements be made to the existing electoral system to improve its performance, proceeded to examine and analyze the existing system, its operation, its weaknesses and its capacity for improvement within the current legal and administrative frame-work. Consideration was also given to the extent to which other participants could contribute to system improvement.

125. The examination and analysis were confined to the two critical areas of its operation, that is, Registration and Voting.

REGISTRATION

126. The existing facilities provide for anyone to register who so wishes, in that:-

/(1) offices are .....

- (1) offices are established in each of the 15 registration areas and such offices are adequately staffed and are open daily during normal working hours;
- (2) on a stated date each year, the electoral lists are published and posted for inspection at two places within the relevant polling divisions and at the appropriate registration office so that an elector may bring any omission to the attention of the relevant officer. Moreover, there is the right of any person to inspect the unit register of electors at registration offices;
- (3) no unnecessary obstacles are placed in the way of the citizen wishing to register, even though there are safeguards against illegal registration such as the requirement that documentary evidence of birth and nationality be produced;
- (4) there is the system of automatic enfranchisement of persons registered before the voting age on their attaining such age. This is among the more progressive measures to be found in any electoral system in the world;
- (5) the records of electors are filed alphabetically, numerically and according to geographical location all of which facilitate easy reference;
- (6) the soon to-be-completed computerization of the registration records will improve the system of recording information and allow for the more expeditious production of a list for replication and for retrieving of information when necessary;
- (7) the period of electoral registration proclaimed by the President before an election is intended to and enables the more dilatory citizens to enfranchise themselves in time for the election. Political parties have the opportunity to check all registration transactions effected during the period since they are entitled to nominate scrutineers to look after their interest. This associates the desirable features of the system of ad hoc registration with the all embracing system of permanent personal registration;
- (8) the completion of the numbering of electricity poles programme in 1982 will provide electors with 'in situ' information on the polling division number in which their residence is located. This will facilitate identification of the location of the posted list of electors and their polling station; and

/(9) the characteristics.....

(9) the characteristics and features of the registration system satisfy all the requirements of a modern system, both in terms of procedures and management. The recent restructuring of the Department - which will provide research and training personnel at university level and additional field staff - is expected to raise considerably the level of performance.

VOTING

127. The voting procedure is neither complex nor cumbersome and achieves that balance between avoiding electoral impropriety while not making the voting process lengthy and tedious.

128. The law provides for a person to vote at the polling station assigned to his residential address if his name appears on the printed and published List of Electors and/or if his registration record card appears in the Unit Register of Electors. An identification card does not suffice inasmuch as it does not contain the address of the holder and it gives no indication of the holder's eligibility to vote in a particular constituency. Such holder may in fact be not eligible to vote in any constituency at all, if his registration had been cancelled for any reason though his identification card was not recovered.

129. The arrangements for voting when once identity is established is simple and uncomplicated. The elector is given a ballot paper and sent with a rubber stamp to the voting booth to imprint the "X" mark of the stamp against the name and symbol of the candidate of his choice. The use of the rubber stamp which is peculiar to this country, avoids the problems of rejection associated with an improperly marked "X" when a pencil is used. On his return the ballot is then placed by the voter himself into the ballot box. Prior to this, the elector's finger is immersed into electoral ink which is an effective means against double voting and personation.

130. The voting procedure has evoked post election comment on the slowness of the process. The reason for this has been explained in another part of this report. Moreover, the Commission is convinced that the changes introduced has had a profound effect in simplifying the voting process.

131. Some cognizance has, however, been paid by the Commission to the view expressed that in an effectively functioning system of permanent personal registration an elector should not necessarily have to check the List of Electors for his name if no event has occurred to disturb his registration status.

132. The Commission, while not conceding the validity of the statement has, however, introduced measures which with the expected co-operation of Political Parties, will reduce, if not totally eliminate, cases of inadvertent omissions.

133. It is clear from the outline of the system given above that this country's electoral system, insofar as the areas of registration and voting

/are concerned.....

are concerned, contains all the control mechanisms, statutory and administrative, necessary for orderly and fair elections.

134. However progressive a system which is not compulsory may be, and whatever the attempts at administrative improvements, which may be made, the co-operation of political parties has an important part to play.

135. Unfortunately, however, the participation of political parties in this country in promoting registration has been seasonal and, significantly, only during the period following the announcement of the date of an election.

136. This seasonal interest was demonstrated clearly at the recent elections. Copies of the list of electors published in December 1980, July 1981 and August 1981 were distributed to all political parties at the time of publication and posting, yet there were few recorded instances of any omissions being brought to the Commission's attention during the period of electoral registration in August 1981 or even after when it would still have been possible to rectify any omissions through inadvertence by the medium of the Supplemental List.

137. It is hoped that the measures proposed with respect to maintaining the register will result in more consistent attention by political parties to voter registration which is a year round activity of the Commission.

PROPOSALS FOR CHANGE

138. Based on its perception of the requirements for improvement in the system, the Commission has or will shortly embark upon the following organizational and functional changes:

- (1) the Commission will provide on a quarterly basis to each political party now functioning and to which a symbol has been assigned, a complete list of the names added and names deleted in each of the 1063 polling divisions in the 14 registration areas in Trinidad and Tobago. This will allow a political party to maintain a complete record of electors in each polling division and would permit such party to assist the Commission in bringing to its attention any inaccuracy noted;
- (2) the Commission will publish periodically for public information, a list of all the persons whose registrations have been cancelled in consequence of their removal from their registered address, and the absence of any information as to their whereabouts;
- (3) the Commission will make available to voters, their poll cards in the week preceding the

/elections so.....

elections so as to further relieve the pressure at the polling stations and to provide another opportunity before the election for a person to enquire into any omission at the office of the registration officer;

- (4) in the absence of a total country-wide registration programme, the Commission will embark on the updating of addresses to accord with the development in certain areas, for example, the replacement of the village name originally given at time of registration by the street name within such village; and
- (5) the Commission will, as indicated earlier, maintain a record of special electors in the defence and protective services which will facilitate the issue of special ballots to such persons, so long as they remain members of such services.

139. Additionally, the Commission will (a) submit proposals for functional amendments to certain Sections and Rules of the Representation of the People Act; and (b) submit proposals for the implementation of programmes with financial implications. Included among these are:

- (1) the introduction of a 'birth to death total register' in which the number assigned on the birth certificate will continue as the registration number when the subject registers in his/her own right;
- (2) the limited use of records of other Government Agencies to effect changes of address where such changes have not been notified. This is easily the most difficult area of the Commission's work;
- (3) the amendment to the law to permit the insertion of additional information on the registration record card and identification cards of registrants, such as blood group and their reference number in the records of other Government Numbering Agencies. This is intended to increase the usefulness of the identification card and thus enhance in the public's eye, the value of registration;
- (4) provision of facilities for persons in the diplomatic service or on Government's business overseas to exercise the franchise;
- (5) a total review of the remuneration paid to election officers and particularly polling day

/staff to.....

staff to ensure the availability of a sufficiently high quality of staff at future election; and

- (6) amendment to the Act to empower District Registrars of Births and Deaths to  
(a) collect the identification cards of deceased persons from informants and  
(b) to provide the Commission with information necessary to identify the registration of the deceased person.  
The information which is now extracted quarterly from the records of the District Registrar of Births and Deaths is sometimes insufficient to assist in identifying the registration.

EXPENDITURE

140. Total expenditure incurred in the conduct of the election (excluding a small number of queried claims) was \$3,173,529. This expenditure was distributed as follows:

The major expenditure under Supplies and Services was incurred on:

- (1) the cost of refurbishing metal ballot boxes, poll card boxes and carrying cases;
- (2) overtime allowance to employees of the Ministry of Works in connection with the use of the Ministry's vehicles by the police during the weekend preceding the election;
- (3) the purchase of a substantial number of units to provide emergency lighting and for the more remote areas; and
- (4) the purchase of the constituent chemicals in the United Kingdom and the United States of America for preparation of electoral ink.

DECLARING REGISTRATION WEEK (27/4-3/5/81) OPEN

Ladies and Gentlemen,

- (1) The Elections and Boundaries Commission has designated the 7-day period beginning Monday, April 27 to Sunday May 3, 1981 as Registration Week in Trinidad and Tobago.
- (2) Some people may ask, why a registration week when there are facilities available throughout the year for registration?
- (3) The answer lies in the fact that hundreds of persons crowd the Commission's offices on polling day with the hope of establishing their right to vote or to ascertain whether their names appear on the List of Electors.
- (4) Another reason is the failure of all these persons who change their place of residence to notify the appropriate registration officer of such change of address.
- (5) A third reason concerns those married women, who posses identification cards in their maiden name and since their marriage, have taken no step to register afresh under their married name.
- (6) Apart from these three reasons, there are those who ask such question as: What must I do to be registered? and others who feel that obstacles are unnecessarily put in the way of the citizen seeking registration. In actual fact, all that is required is for the person seeking registration to go to the appropriate registration officer with the necessary documents to establish identity.
- (7) The purpose of Registration Week is, therefore, to highlight registration and to focus attention on the facilities provided by the Election and Boundaries Commission for registration and matters incidental thereto and to provide special facilities for the more lethargic of our citizens so that it will not be possible for them to say "I did not know," or "I did not have the time."
- (8) A few minutes spent at the registration centre now will perhaps save you hours of waiting during the period of peak activity.
- (9) This country has what is perhaps the most accommodating registration system in the world. It should, therefore be possible to produce the most up to date list for an election.
- (10) Without the co-operation of citizens, however, this cannot be achieved in a system in which registration is voluntary and there are no sanctions attached to non-compliance.
- (11) The Commission stands ready to do its part. The ball is, therefore, in your court.
- (12) It is, therefore, with the expectation of total public participation that I have pleasure in declaring Registration Week open, and in so doing, I commend to you the words of our late Prime Minister in describing the Nation Identification Card when he spoke during a Registration Week in August 1961.

"It makes you feel that you belong to  
Trinidad and Tobago, and it proves that  
you do belong. It is an elegant Docu-  
ment of which you will be proud when you  
receive it."
